Saint Thomas More and Saint John Fisher are two great saints and martyrs. They share the same feast day, June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Both were martyred in 1535. Both were great Christian role models.

These two great English saints lived at the very same time. They lived in turbulent times for the church in England. They lived in a society a little like our own. It was a time when the church had little credibility.

Both saints fearlessly stood up in defense of the faith. Both put their lives at risk for the Gospel. One used his abilities as a lawyer. The other used his abilities as a bishop. They were ever mindful of God. Both had fidelity in the midst of great change.

At that time Henry VIII was king of England. He wanted to set himself up as head of the Church in England. He wanted to break away from the pope in Rome.

King Henry VIII wanted to change the church to suit his wants and needs. However, both men refused to compromise their consciences. Both stood fast to their beliefs and to their faith. Neither was forgetful of God and His plan for our freedom and eternal salvation.

Saint John Fisher was the only bishop in all of England at that time to publicly disobey the ruling monarch. He knew that opposing the king meant that he stood in danger of losing his head. Nevertheless he was fearlessly courageous and literally lost his head.

Saint Thomas More, a married man, who at that time held the high office of Chancellor of England declared before his death: "I stand the King's good servant, but God's first". Not only is he the patron saint of our parish but also recognized as the patron saint of lawyers, statesmen and politicians.

#### TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JUNE 9, 2013

#### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 16, 2013 - Luke 7:36-8:3

A sinful woman entered and began to bathe Jesus' feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and anointed them with the ointment. When the Pharisee who had invited Jesus saw this he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner."

Jesus said to him, "Do you see this woman?"

#### Commentary:

Jesus asks, "Do you see this woman?" The Pharisee looks at her and sees only a sinner. Jesus looks at her and sees a sinner who repents. He sees her tremendous humility, her great sorrow, her desire to minister to him in his need, her "great love," her saving faith. The woman sees Jesus as One whom she can love and who loves her in return. This relationship brings her salvation and peace.

While the woman and her actions seem to be the center piece of this gospel, what is really central is openness to others, accepting them for who they are, and seeing rightly into our own hearts before we judge the heart of another. Jesus is the model for seeing rightly. What does Jesus see when he looks at us? What do we see when we look at one another?

#### **Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
