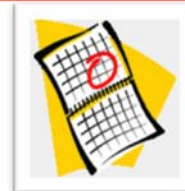

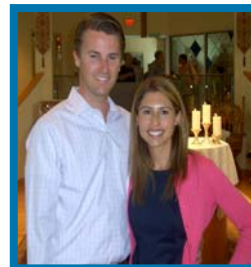

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 28, 2013 - Luke 11:1-13

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Commentary:

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples "how" to pray by teaching them the Our Father. Jesus then advises his listeners to be persistent in prayer and to never tire of asking for what is needed. My mother had a saying that went like this: "Ask and you don't get; don't ask and you don't want." In other words, we who were children at the time could not win. Jesus tells us something else. He says that we should be persistent in prayer and God will reward us with the Holy Spirit. In other words, what we ask for in prayer will be granted if we have the faith needed. "Everyone who asks receives." Jesus encourages faith and persistence. He never tires of hearing us ask, in prayer, for what we need.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
