

The Pope's Interview

Fr. Phillip Johnson

I interrupt my "Catholic Faith in Slow Motion" series to share a few thoughts about the recent interview with our new pope that caused something of a media stir. This wide-ranging interview, published last week, took place during three meetings in August. It was conducted by Antonio Sarada, S.J., chief editor of *La Civita Cattolica*, on behalf of a number of Jesuit magazines around the world, including the English language publication *America*. Reductive Headlines . . .

Speaking to a group of graduating university students, Bill Clinton once advised that, if you care about the truth of a newspaper report, skip the headline, scan the first couple of paragraphs, and turn to the "back story" where the actual facts and details can be found. Good advice. However, when it comes to the secular media coverage of Catholic matters, even the "back pages" may be of little use.

Reductive thinking (impatient, simplistic, sound-bite thinking that can't escape caricature and distortion) is the intellectual original sin. It kills understanding. Reductive thinking is often caused by laziness, by bias, by ideological commitments, and especially by *impatience with mystery*. It results in the inability to step out of familiar categories of thought that are inadequate to the subject at hand. With regard to the "news and analysis" of popes, the familiar categories are "conservative" and "liberal" as applied to certain hot button issues that are these days so troubling to the peace of the Catholic Church.

So, when Pope Francis says, for example—in that open and frank way of his that both charms and alarms—that we cannot be all the time talking about abortion or birth control, that there are many matters of justice that the Church must attend to, conservatives fear and liberals hope that some dramatic change in the Church's teaching is on the horizon. Or when the holy father thinks out loud about the suffering of a young man with homosexual desires, asking, "who am I to judge?" the same sorts of fears and hopes line up apposite one another.

From many of the headlines, you would have no idea that, in a long and leisurely interview (12,000 words) only a few sentences are given to these matters. And what they address is not the substantive teachings of the Church but the call to speak and live the truth with love—as our pope says, to welcome sinners in love and *begin* with wherever they are on their journey. The fact is, there is nothing in the interview, nor in the history of this remarkable Christian pastor, that signals a break with the substantive teaching of the Church.

Evangelism, not Imperialism . . .

My "take" on our new pope might seem to comfort conservatives and distress liberals. But hold on. It can hardly be denied that this pope's manner and words, his true simplicity of life and love for the poor, his casting off of traditional trappings of papal dignity, his call to abandon all moral and religious triumphalism do, in fact, signal serious change in *papal and Catholic self-understanding*. But this change did not begin with Pope Francis I; it has been at work a long time (so I don't buy the reductive contrasts with his recent predecessors, none of whom fit easily into the accepted conservative—Liberal dualism). To understand this change of direction I would recommend George Weigel's book *Evangelical Catholicism* (published well before the present pope took office). Maybe I will find opportunity in a future article to ponder some parts of Weigel's analysis, which I think offers both conservatives and liberals much to think about. Meanwhile, I hope you will read every word of this lovely interview with our 266th Bishop of Rome.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 6, 2013 - Luke 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do."

Commentary:

In the Gospel reading, the disciples ask for an increase in faith. Jesus is saying they do not need to be heroes. An ordinary amount of trust in God's help will help them accomplish great things. Transplanting a mulberry tree into the sea is a highly exaggerated example. It serves, however, to make the point: "What is impossible for human beings is possible for God." (Luke 18:27)

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
