



The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (No. 29)

A series of reflections about thinking, praying, professing and living the Faith of the Church.

Knowing God and Loving God: Part Two

Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an expiation of our sins (1 John 4:8-10).

To know God is to love God, and only in loving God can we truly know God. Because a true knowledge of God is *personal* knowledge, and true love of God is *personal* love. To know that God is omnipotent and omniscient is to know something true about God. But this sort of knowledge is theoretical. Such knowledge can produce a kind of intellectual wonder, but not personal love. In personal relations, it is only by loving that we gain a true knowledge of another. That was the point of last week's reflection.

Who God is . . .

But how is it that we "get to know" another person? How do we come to know *who* another person is. "Who is she?" we ask. The answer involves *identifying* her. "Oh, that's Mary, she's the daughter of . . . she is the one who she is the one that Identifying a person involves beginning to put together a kind of personal narrative. And eventually, if I am to get to know Mary, she will need to take up the narrative herself, she will have to be willing to tell me something of her personal story.

What does this have to do with knowing and loving God? Well, how is it that Christians "identify" God? How does Scripture speak of "who" God is? God is the *One who* created heaven and earth the *One who* suddenly appeared to Abraham . . . the *One who* called the people of Israel out of slavery . . . the *One who* called and inspired the prophets . . . the *One who* sent his own Son, his eternal Word into the world through the womb of Mary. It is chiefly the narrative line of Holy Scripture that answers the question *Who* God is. Sure, Holy Scripture also communicates a certain theoretical knowledge of God (all powerful, all merciful, etc.). But it is only in the narrative that these divine attributes are integrated into a truly personal identity. Which explains why narrative is the dominant literary form in Holy Scripture.

God's Personal Relationships . . .

To know and love Mary involves coming to know and love others who are crucial to Mary's identity—her parents and siblings, for example. Just so, knowing and loving God includes close company with all those whom God loves, becoming part of the narrative of God's chosen relationships (Israel-Church, the poor and needy, etc.). Yet more mysteriously, it means being invited into the innermost relation of Love that makes up *Who* God is. For this is the great secret finally revealed as the Narrative comes to its climax: the love of the eternal Father for the Eternal Son in the eternal Communion of their shared Holy Spirit.

What does it mean to know and love God? It means to know and love the Father revealed by the Son, and to love the Son given by Father, and to love all those whom the Spirit calls into their fellowship.

A Love that Loves the Unlovely?

But there is a nagging question so far ignored. Is it really true that to know others is to love them? Does not our knowledge of one another uncover a great deal of unloveliness? Yes, and God's personal narrative confirms this dark and bloody truth. And yet: "In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an expiation of our sins (1 John 4:10). For Christ's sake, may God grant us the Love to make one another loveable.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 26, 2014 - Matt. 4:12-23

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, Jesus saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him.

Commentary:

Imagine the scene in your neighborhood. Jesus walks down the street, calling all who hear his voice to follow him. And there go your neighbors one by one, abandoning their computers and television sets, gardening tools and supper preparations, cell phones and homework, to fall in behind a virtual stranger. Why do they do it? Some go because they hate what they were doing and are looking for any excuse to shirk their responsibilities. Some go out of curiosity because they are bored and yearn for something interesting to happen. Some go because they have felt neglected or ignored and are grateful to be asked. Some even go because they were startled by the call they heard, by the insistence in the voice that roused them to feelings they can scarcely name. For the best reasons and for the worst, lots of people leave everything behind and follow Jesus. And you know what? All of them are better off than the ones who never even looked up to see who just passed by.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saving to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
