## STORY TELLING IN SMALL CHRISTIAN COMMUNITIES

There is a wealth of research on how story telling and faith-sharing can enhance our spiritual lives. When we tell our stories and share our faith we grow in our faith.

Story telling and faith sharing can enhance and bring to life in our lives the human and spiritual character strengths of forgiveness, honesty, gratitude and outreach.

Story telling and faith sharing are our way of sharing our wealth of experience. It is our unique way of connecting with God. The story telling deepens our awareness of the daily involvement of God in our lives.

Story telling builds relationships with those in our group. It builds trust among the members. Story telling has the power to convince and persuade other people that God is interactive in our lives. God's presence becomes more visible and more alive.

Story telling persuades people much more than handing them facts or quoting dogmas. Story telling is much more effective in shaping the character of one's soul and the souls of others than memorizing prayers and quoting dogmas or policies.

Story telling can have an enormous impact on us and on others. Sharing your personal story with others is a great way to get your message to stick. Sharing your story makes your message seem much more authentic and much more approachable.

When you share your story, you prompt others to open up about how God is moving in their lives too. They come to see with more clarity how God fits into the very fabric of the very ordinary happenings of their lives too.

Story telling promotes the awareness that spirituality and God are at the very core of our human identity. Spirituality is very central and very critical to a great majority of those who attend church and those who do not attend church.

We bring our spirituality with us wherever we go. We bring our spirituality with us when we walk in and walk out of the door of the church. This is the one critical asset that is always with us and that we need to feed.

And the small faith sharing group experiences nurture our spiritual identities. They nurture our religious beliefs too. In the story telling we refresh our sense of purpose in this life and our belief in a life hereafter.

## Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 16, 2014 - Matthew 5:17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the Kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard it said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill'...but I say to you, whoever is angry with brother or sister will be liable to judgment."

"You have heard it said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery in his heart."

"Your ancestors said, 'Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow.' But I say to you, do not swear at all."

### Commentary:

One by one, Jesus takes the various laws in all their externality and draws out **their inner roots**. One injunction had been against *killing*. But the inside of that law is, do not ever act out of anger for your brother (or sister). Not even the word *raqa* may be spoken. *You shall not commit adultery*. The inside of that law is, be pure enough to not even look lustfully at a woman. And, *divorce*. The interior law is to stay faithful and loving within your marriage relationship. Finally, the matter of *oaths* and swearing. Jesus diagnoses this simply: you are trying to make up for your weakness by putting almighty power behind your words. Just say yes or not, and mean it. Why does Jesus dig so deep? The inside of the law is written in Jesus' heart. May it be written in ours as well.

### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
