

The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (No. 52)

Fr. Phillip Johnson

A series of reflections about professing, praying, thinking, and living the Faith of the Church.

A Very Brief Bible Study About the Offering of Money

In the New Testament *Acts of the Apostles* St. Luke gives us several "snap-shots" of the life of the very first Christian Church in Jerusalem. Peter and most of the apostles are still residents in Jerusalem. All of them mention the extraordinary generosity that marked the community of faith. Here is once such portrait

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own. . . . There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributing to each one according to need (Acts 5:32-35).

Moving forward several years, to around A.D. 55, we have another portrait, this one from St. Paul in his two Letters to the Church in Corinth. Paul appeals to the Corinthian Church to give of their money so that it may be sent to Christians in Jerusalem who are suffering a terrible famine. He writes that "in regard to the collection for the holy ones. . . . On the first day of the week each of you should set aside and save whatever one can afford" (1 Cor. 16:1-2).

Later, in his second letter (chapters 8 and 9) the apostle makes a more lengthy appeal, providing what could be called a brief catechism on the *spiritual meaning* of their money offerings. Here are some of the principles and effects of giving as laid down by St. Paul.

The offering is a sure testimony of love's reality. Paul makes the appeal "to test the genuineness of your love by your concern for others" (8:8).

The offering is an act of grace in response to the Grace of Christ. "For you know the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that for your sake he became poor although he was rich, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (8:9).

The offering should be proportional. All are to give generously but those who have much should give much, those who have little will give less. It is a matter of fairness. In this St. Paul invokes the Old Testament teaching regarding "tithing" — purposefully dedicating a percentage of one's income as an offering to God.

You cannot out-give God. "Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things . . . you may have abundance for every good work" (9:8).

The act of generous giving is an act of worship and thanksgiving to God, and a profession of faith. "For this service is not only supplying the needs of the holy ones but is also overflowing in many acts of thanksgiving to God. . . . You are glorifying God for your obedient confession of the gospel of Christ" (9:12 -13). Which is why the collection takes place within the chief liturgy of the Church.

The act of generous giving is a joyful act. "Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (9:7).



Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Nov. 23, 2014 - Matt. 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left."

Commentary:

Today's description of the last judgment goes further than any other. This final judgment determines what counts in the end. It is not success or how perfectly a person has developed. In the end, the judgment is about love for the poorest, the no-accounts, the ones easy to miss. It is not about doing good or charitable things for a cause or out of a sense of duty. What counts is doing real practical good out of genuine love. Jesus tells us that when we do this, we are serving Jesus himself.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
