“I am the Lord who brought you up from Ur of the Chaldees to give you this land as a possession.” Genesis 15: 7

Just as the Lord gave Abraham, Moses and the Israelites a land to possess, He has also given each of us a home. Whether our home is grand or humble, it is a gift from God. Abraham prepared a great sacrifice to the Lord in gratitude for the home God gave him, How do we as **Stewards** show our gratitude to God for the home He has given us? Do we make a sacrifice of any kind? Do we return any of our finances to God, investing equally in our eternal home just as we invest in our earthly home?

Mercy at the Door

*A Reflection on the New Marian Image,
Installed and Consecrated on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, 2015*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women,
and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

The December 2015 issue of the National Geographic had as its cover a detail from a 15th century painting of “The Virgin Mary and the Child” by Sandro Botticelli, which currently hangs in Milan, Italy. We see the inclined head, downcast eyes, and prayerful countenance of the beautiful young Mother of God. Although we cannot see the entire painting, we know instinctively (from so many Christmas cards, prayer books, postage stamps, and music covers) that the tender, humble, and loving gaze is focused on her newborn – Jesus, Emmanuel, God “born in the likeness of men . . . being found in human form.” (Phil 2:7-8)

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners,
now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Another detail of the inclined, downward-gazing head of the Virgin has recently been installed over the main door to our church. It is a reproduction of Michelangelo’s *Pieta* (translated as *Mercy, Pity, Compassion*). The marble sculpture, dated 1499, is now housed in St. Peter’s Basilica, Vatican City. The image, less familiar to some, but no less central to our faith, recalls Mary looking down in sorrow on the bruised and broken body of that same God-Son who “humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross.” (Phil 2:8). This is Michelangelo’s depiction of what we often refer to as *The Thirteenth Station: Jesus is Taken Down From the Cross*.

The Bible tells us nothing of what Mary the Mother of God said or thought as she stood beneath her suffering son for hours and then received his broken, lifeless body as the Sabbath approached. But she must have been flooded with memories of those joyful mysteries: The Annunciation, The Visitation, The Nativity, The Presentation, The Finding of Jesus in the Temple - - - the moments when she listened, questioned, pondered, struggled, believed, and rejoiced. And how could she have failed to recall the words of old Simeon, who lifted her beautiful newborn from her arms on their very first visit to the temple, saying, “. . . and a sword will pierce your soul also . . .” (Luke 2:35)

Mary is the Mother of God in the Manger. Mary is the Mother of God on the Cross . . . and beyond. She calls each of us, the baptized sons and daughters of God, the adopted sisters and brothers of Jesus, to accompany her in the Family of the Church as we travel toward Eternity. As we bring our infants to the font of holy baptism and our dead to the pall of Christian burial through this door of our church, Mary the Mother of God looks down on us in mercy. She knows we are blessed; she knows we suffer. She reminds us to listen, ponder, question, struggle, believe, and rejoice as we join her day by day in adoring the God-Son who was born, who died, and who lives forever

Come, let us worship Him!

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent, February 28, 2016 – Luke 13:1-9

Jesus told this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.'"

Commentary:

Another name for God is Compassion. It's a word that means "to suffer with," and in the life of Jesus, we see how God came to reveal that name to us. In the story of the orchard, we often think God is represented by the impatient owner who wants the fruitless tree cut down. Since we've been taught to think of God as the great Judge in the sky, this identification makes sense. But in the story, Jesus takes the role of the gardener who desires to rescue the tree from imminent destruction. One more year, he begs, and I shall try again to coax this barren tree into life. That second chance is offered to each of us from the God of Second Chances, the God who cares about flailing humanity unable to pull its act together despite a long history of knowing better. Each Lent is that second chance, another season that comes to us like a gift and an opportunity to turn the page and the corner on where we've been headed.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

Precisely in order to have life, a "no" is said to the child, because it takes some part of my life away from me; a "no" is said to the future, in order to have the whole of the present; a "no" is said to the unborn life as well as to the suffering that is approaching death. What seems to be a culture of life becomes the anti-culture of death, where God is absent, where that God who does not ordain hatred but overcomes hatred is absent. 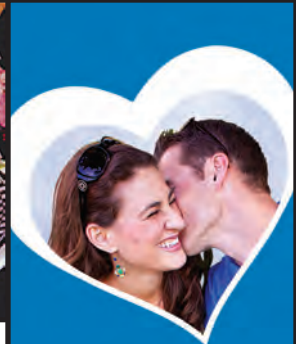
