Mass of the Anointing of the Sick: In the Sacrament of the *Anointing of the Sick*, we pray that the sick will be healed in body, in soul and in spirit. - ▶ Those preparing for surgery

This Sacrament brings the healing strength of the Lord. Sometimes His healing comes by way of the person accepting their condition and relying on God's graces.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Third Sunday of Easter, April 10, 2016 – John 21: 1-19

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Peter said to Jesus, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." Jesus then said to Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter said, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to Peter the third time, "Simon, son of John do you love me?" Peter was distressed that he had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and Peter said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."

Commentary:

Peter feels bad at being asked three times about his love for Jesus. Peter has failed at love, totally blown it, and he knows it. We've all been traitors to love time and again in many ways: as selfish spouses, unfairly critical parents, thoughtless friends, or insensitive neighbors. Most of all, we have not loved God the way we're supposed to. So what do we do when we've failed miserably at love? Why not reaffirm our love three times: for anyone we have offended. Jesus seems quite ready to receive Peter's love again without penalty. In fact, as the story goes, Peter's affirmation of love is rewarded with greater trust than before. Despite our faulty history, we may wind up in charge of larger things.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
