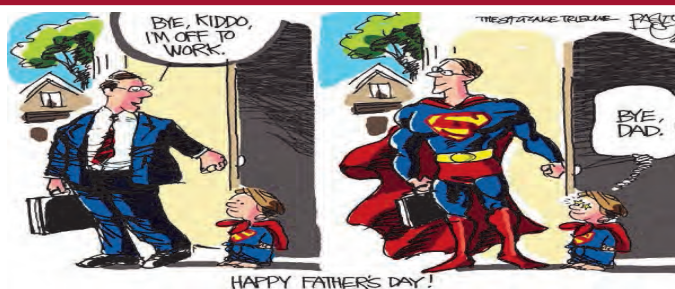

## TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JUNE 19, 2016

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 26, 2016 - Luke 9:51-62

(Jesus enters a village where he is not accepted. James and John want to call down fire from heaven to punish the unwelcoming people. Jesus rebukes them. They continue on their journey where Jesus encounters various people who wish to follow Jesus but are unwilling to do so NOW.) "And to another Jesus said, 'Follow me.' But he replied, 'Lord, let me go first and bury my father.' But Jesus answered him, 'Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.'"

#### Commentary:

Some passages in Scripture are called "hard sayings" because they seem harsh to the ear. The third person who comes to Jesus wants to bury his father before he follows Jesus. We imagine rigor mortis setting in on the deathbed, but that's not what this fellow means. He is actually saying that he's willing to follow Jesus after the death of his father. In all of the instances mentioned in this gospel, Jesus replies in basically the same way: Come now, and come without terms, or don't come at all. We have to put ourselves at the service of the kingdom of God in the present hour, because it's the only hour that belongs to us.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

#### Six Ways I Can Make My Parish Better *Second in a Series*

**2. Be welcoming** When you come together on the weekend for Mass, think of it as a large family reunion—with people you know well, know slightly, and don't know at all.

Introduce yourself to people you don't know, especially if they are sitting alone in church or standing by themselves at the coffee- and -donut hour. If they're new to the parish, offer to give them a tour, introduce them to other parishioners, or simply tell them why you love the parish. Enthusiasm is catching!

Watch your non-verbal communication, too. If you're sitting on the end of a pew, for example, don't make others crawl over you to get to middle seats. Remember to smile; take the time to compliment the people sitting around you on everything from their singing to the cuteness of their kids.

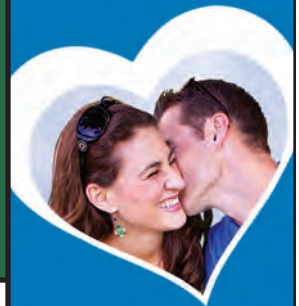
