Mission Co-Op Appeal Next Weekend!

Fr. Anthony Balthasar from India **will be here next weekend** telling us about the needs of the Diocese of Kumbakonam.

The missionary goals for the Diocese are as follows:

1. **Construction of 20 more parishes** to accommodate the Catholic population;
2. **Construction of convents.** There are 501 nuns in charge of catechetical, educational, medical and social ministries. They need places to live;
3. Since education is a main means of evangelization here, the diocese has to **provide buildings and infrastructure to the schools in remote villages** while the government will pay the teachers;
4. **Education of 2000 very poor or orphaned children from remote villages every year** by providing them with free board and lodging.

The diocese is trying to realize these goals, depending on the availability of funds. The mission and spiritual prospects of Kumbakonam are bright but its needs are pressing.

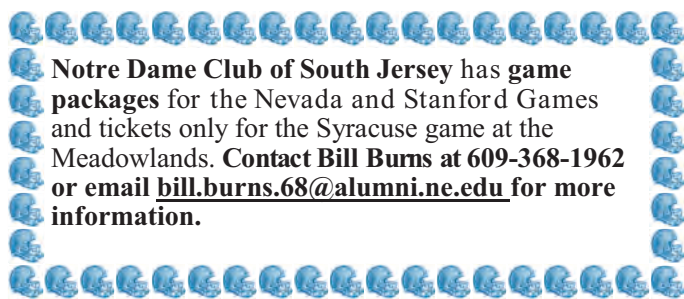

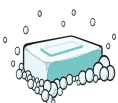

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 31, 2016 - Luke 12:13-21

"Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me.' Jesus replied to him, 'Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?' Then Jesus said to the crowd, 'Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions.'"

Commentary:

Inheritance is the mother lode of all wealth, of course, precisely because it is not earned. It is also one of the touchiest money matters because of the way it can divide the affections of families. Jesus refuses to wade into this business with one indignant heir. Instead, he widens the focus of the issue to how we are tempted to fixate on wealth above all other matters. Is an inheritance more important than a brother? Is money more valuable than time? Is our net worth a greater concern than the person we are becoming as we make our bank deposits? Greed City may be a nice place to visit, but we can't live there forever.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

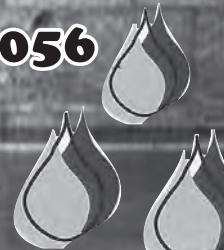
