## Don't Forget The Jubilee Year of Mercy

It began on December 8, 2015, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. It will conclude on Sunday, November 20 of this year, on Christ the King Sunday. Pope Francis announced the Year of Mercy with the following words:

I have often thought of how the Church may render more clear her mission to be a witness to mercy; and we have to make this journey. It is a journey that begins with spiritual conversion. Therefore, I have decided to announce an *Extraordinary Jubilee* that has at its center the mercy of God. . . . We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord: “Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful” (cf. Luke 6:36). . . .

I am confident that the whole Church, which is in such need of mercy, for we are sinners, will be able to find in this Jubilee the joy of rediscovering and rendering fruitful God’s mercy. . . . Do not forget that God *forgives all*, and God *forgives always*. Let us never tire of asking forgiveness. Let us henceforth entrust this Year to the Mother of Mercy, that she turn her gaze upon us and watch over our journey: our penitential journey, our year-long journey with an open heart, to receive the indulgence of God, to receive the mercy of God. . . .

The pope’s words bring together a double perspective. He speaks of the mercy of God that each of us so desperately needs; and at the same time he speaks of the mercy that we are called upon to lavish upon others. “Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful”. The receiving and the giving inevitably go together. The mercy you and I show to others is not *our* mercy. It is *God’s* mercy, which we have received and which flows through us to others.

Here and elsewhere, the pope’s words shine a bright light on the Sacrament of Confession. The whole of the Christian life is a constant receiving of forgiveness. All the sacraments are signs and offerings of God’s mercy. But in the confessional, God’s mercy takes on a one-to-one sacramental intimacy all its own. The personal act of confessing our sins with honesty, in a state of spiritual nakedness before God, is met by the direct and personal Word of God’s forgiveness through the human voice of the priest. Pope Francis speaks of the spiritual strength God grants us as we make our way to Confession..

The transformation of the heart that leads us to confess our sins is a “gift from God”. We cannot do it alone. The power to confess our sins is a gift from God . . . it is “his work” (cf. Eph 2:8-10). Being touched with tenderness by his hand and molded by his grace allows us to draw near to the priest without fear for our sins, but with the certainty that we will be accepted by him in the name of God, and understood despite our wretchedness; and even to approach without a defense attorney: we have the One who alone gave his life for our sins! It is He who always defends us before the Father. He always defends us. As we exit the confessional, we will feel his strength that gives new life and restores ardor to the faith. After confession we are reborn.

The pope imagines our way to the confession as a holy pilgrimage. In this Jubilee of Mercy, let’s not squander The Grace of God. “Today, when you hear his voice, do not harden you hearts” (Ps. 95).

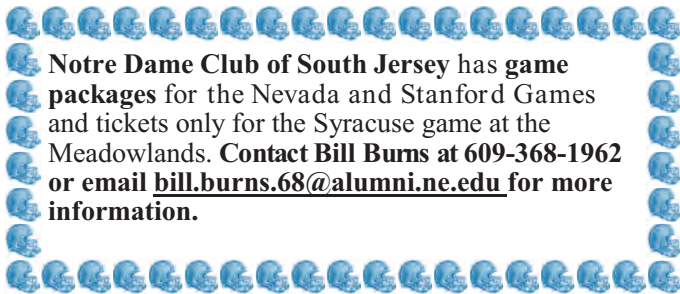

## EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JULY 31, 2016

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 7, 2016 - Luke 12:32-48

"Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

#### Commentary:

It's encouraging to think of good things done in secret, but we know that a lot of what happens under cover of darkness is not good. While no one is looking, dieters cheat, workers slack off, murders are committed, violence is perpetrated, children are abused, the sick are neglected, the poor slide into despair, and lovers are unfaithful. Jesus issues a strong warning to those who act one way when observed and another when no one is looking. Integrity comes from a root word meaning whole or entire. Our wholeness depends on our being the same person all the time, to those with power over us as with those over whom we exercise authority, in the dark as in the light. If we're nice to some and mean to others, respectful or abusive depending on the situation, honest or deceitful in turns, we are in grave danger of losing ourselves completely.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



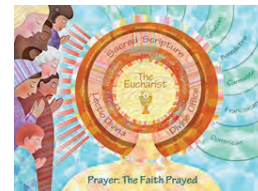

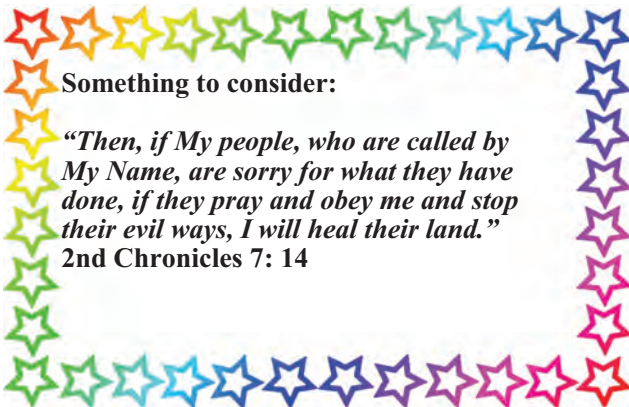

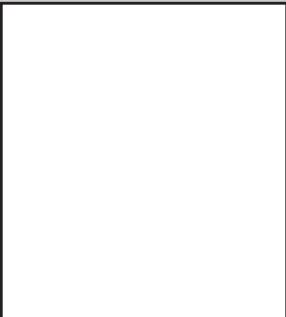
