Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 6, 2016 Luke 19: 1-10

Some Sadducees who did not believe in a resurrection, tried to trick Jesus by posing a question about seven brothers, marrying the same woman, each man dying before a child is produced. They question, "At the Resurrection, whose wife will that woman be?" Jesus responds, "Those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise."

Commentary

Since God is infinite, much of what God says is a mystery to us. So we often find ourselves substituting good guesses for what we cannot fully understand. That's fine, so long as we do not mistake them for actual answers and final definitions. The Sadducees who came to Jesus with the question about the wife of seven brothers were less than sincere in the asking, of course. Many people are very interested in precise information about Heaven. The only question worth asking about Heaven is: "Will you and I be there?" That's the only question we can definitively answer with our lives.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

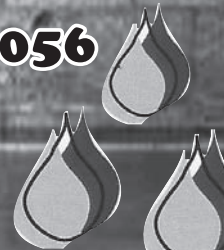
