SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME FEBRUARY 19, 2017

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 26, 2017 - Matthew 6:24-34

Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?" "So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' Your heavenly Father knows that you need them. Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all things will be given to you as well."

Commentary:

Jesus challenges us to put our trust only in God. Jesus tells his followers, "You cannot give yourself to God and money." The operative words here are "give yourself". To live a responsible life in today's world, we must deal with financial concerns. But when this concern becomes an obsession, money (or a career) becomes one's goal, one's god, one's master. What we are and what we have are gifts from God. Excessive worry indicates a lack of trust in God.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



"To forget murder victims is to kill them twice." Elie Weisel. This certainly applies to the countless unborn babies who have been murdered in their own mother's wombs by abortion. Pray that all who have a hand in abortion or euthanasia will seek God's forgiveness and choose life.

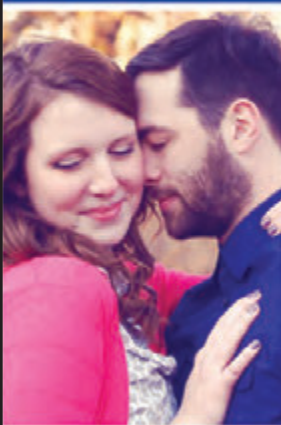

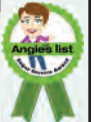
