Reflections about professing, praying, thinking, and living the Faith of the Church

Praying Every Day: Help From the Church's Treasury of Prayer

In last week's reflection we pondered St. Paul's words: "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17). I suggested that, for most of us, a constant habit of prayer begins with a regular discipline of "saying our prayers". This involves a chosen set of prayers that have been commended to us by the Christian devotional tradition.

A Catholic Christian needs a good prayer book. I recommend two very fine publications. The *Handbook of Prayers*, published by the Midwest Theological Forum, provides a wealth of Catholic devotion. A second publication is the beautifully printed *Magnificat*—a monthly missalette received by mail (www.magnificat.com). It provides, not only morning, evening, and night prayers, but also the mass readings and prayers for every day of the of year. Both publications provide online resources. Both are easily portable. Both will deepen your understanding and participation in the Church's devotion.

It is a great help to have a few memorized prayers to "carry" with you throughout the day—prayers that can be quietly spoken or silently called to mind in the midst of the day's responsibilities and challenges. Many Catholics know by heart the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel—a cry for protection and strength in the spiritual battles we must fight every day. Here are some lesser-known examples of what I call pocket prayers.

+ **In the morning:** *O Lord, almighty and ever living God, you have brought me in safety to this new day. Preserve me with your mighty power, that I may not fall into sin nor be overcome in adversity, and in everything I do direct me to the fulfilling of your purpose; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

+ **In the afternoon hours:** *Heavenly Father in whom we live and move and have our being: We humbly pray you so to guide and govern us by your Holy Spirit, that in all the cares and occupations of our life, we may not forget you, but remember that we are ever walking in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord.*

+ **At bedtime:** *We give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have this day so graciously protected us. We beg you to forgive us all our sins and the wrong that we have done. By your great mercy defend us from all the perils and dangers of this night. Into your hands we commend our bodies and souls, and all that is ours. Let your holy angels have charge of us, that the wicked one may have no power over us. Amen.*

+**At any time, the prayer of St. Ignatius Loyola:** *Receive, Lord, my entire freedom. Accept the whole of my memory, my intellect and my will. Whatever I have or possess, it was you who gave it to me; I restore it to you in full, and I surrender it completely to the guidance of your will. Give me only love of you, together with your grace, and I am rich enough and ask for nothing more. Amen.*

I don't need to remind you of the beloved *Hail Mary*, a prayer that, in its repetition, enfolds us in Christ's love. And of course, there is the fountainhead of all prayer: *Our Father* . . . Every Christian must strive to know the deep intimacy offered us by the eternal Son of God, who himself places on our lips and in our heart the words of the Our Father. These prayers we "pray without ceasing" because through them we enter the mystery of a never ceasing Love.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 18, 2017 - John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: “I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.

Commentary:

People objected when Jesus talked about offering his life for the sake of the world. We still hear plenty of objections to this kind of talk. Some of us find the idea of self-sacrifice noble in the realm of soldiers armed with guns. But what if somebody walks into the heart of danger armed only with the truth? What if our children choose religious life over careers in law and medicine? What if a friend decides to work in a crime-filled neighborhood, or to become politically active in an unpopular issue? How do we view these self-sacrificing decisions? With alarm? With unbelief? Until we embrace the spirit of self-sacrifice, we’re standing with the crowds who thought the “angel food” talk of Jesus was pure lunacy.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

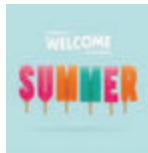
