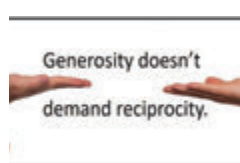

The Lord's Day

The Sanctification of Time . . .

In our time, time itself has become problematic. “There is never enough time,” we complain, unless, that is, we are in the midst of some misery, then “time crawls” and there is too much time. The problem of time is, of course, all tied up with the problem of death. The frantic race against time, has much to do with this race against death. The monk Thomas Merton wrote about the anxiety of the “modern pagan,” the “child of technology,” who “lives not only below the level of grace but below the level of nature—below his own humanity. . . . In such a world, a man's life is no longer even a seasonal cycle. It is a linear flight into nothingness, a flight from reality and from God” (*Meditations on Liturgy*, p. 31).

The gospel of Jesus Christ banishes this demonic fear of time. By his resurrection from the dead, Christ has declared his Lordship over time, banishing the demons that would make time our enemy. By faith in Christ, time is no longer the thief that steals away our happiness; it is the herald announcing the approach of a destination. In the rhythms of the Church’s liturgical calendar, by her sacramental time keeping, the Church announces Christ's “taming” of time. Christian worship breathes with this sense of the transformation of time.

Sabbath Rest . . . The Lord's Day . . .

“Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy” (Ex. 20:8; Deut. 5:12). This third commandment of the Decalogue established the principle of biblical time keeping. As the Creator finished his labors on the seventh (sabbath) day—declaring the creation finished—just so God's creatures may join in in the Creator’s sabbath rest. *We are commanded to rest as an act of faith in our Creator.* God is Creator and we are not.

After Christ “rested” from the “labor” of our redemption, after his sabbath rest in the grave, he was raised to Life Eternal, establishing the first day of all days. The Sabbath or seventh day was not forgotten; it was *fulfilled*. Its meaning is taken up into the new “Day of the Sun”— “when the disciples gathered together on the First Day of the Week to break bread” (Acts 20:7). From the first, Christians were urged to keep this day “not to neglect the meeting together, as is the habit of some, but to encourage one another” (Heb.10:25).

“The Church which waits for her Lord and anticipates the revelation of his lordship over all the kingdoms of this world, will never abandon the sign of Sunday. . . . This day proclaims loudly to all the world, even the modern heathen world, that man through his own care and work can never build the kingdom of eternal glory” (A. De Querrain). This is why the law of the Church makes clear that Sunday “is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church” (can. 1246)

Holy Leisure . . .

As an ancient Christian sermon urges: “Come to Church early, approach the Lord, and confess your sins, repent in prayer. . . . Be present at the Sacred and Divine Liturgy, conclude in prayer and do not leave before the dismissal. . . . This day is given to you for prayer and rest. This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it.”

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept. 17, 2017 - Matt. 18:21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times."

Commentary:

Peter's not fooling anyone, not the least the discerning heart of Jesus. His real question to his teacher is not, "How often must I forgive?" but rather "When can I legitimately stop forgiving my brother?" It's a question most of us will face many times in dealing with that most difficult and dreadful species: the family member. After all, with whom do we have the most dealings, and who is most likely to require our multiple and protracted forgiveness?

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
