# The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (No.104)

Fr. Phillip Johnson

A series of reflections about thinking, praying, professing and living the Faith of the Church

## Dignity and Destiny (Part One)

*See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called Children of God... Beloved, we are God's children now; it does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when Christ appears we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. And everyone who so hopes in Christ purifies himself, as he is pure (First Letter of John 3:1-3).*

### *The Paradox of Christian Self-regard . . .*

It's sometime said of a man (and not as a compliment), "He thinks too much of himself; he could do with a dose of humility." But consider the words above from St. John. Meditating on those words, we might come to see that the man's real problem may be that he *thinks too little of himself*. In fact, humility in the Christian sense, does not derive from a lesser sense of self but from an almost unthinkably high self-regard. Perhaps you have sometimes chastised yourself: "I want too much in life. I need to reign in my expectations." In the right context this might be a most useful self-examination. But considering the promises of God addressed to us by Jesus, the danger is that, in the light of God's promises, you haven't learned to think more highly of yourself; you want far too little out of life!

In order to be the selves we are created to be, we must desire *all* that God wishes to give us. Humility is indeed a Christian virtue. But the only personal humility that is rooted in reality is the humility that openheartedly receives the dignity God has bestowed on us. *See what love the Father has given us that we should be called Children of God (Jn. 3:1).*

### *Our End is in Our Beginning . . .*

"Let us make man in our own image, after our likeness.... In the image of God he created him; male and female he created them" (Gen. 1:26, 27). A human being is not simply a creature infinitely more intelligent and capable than other creatures, not simply the highest animal species, but a creature *called* to live in intimate friendship with the Creator, even to share the eternal life of the Creator!

Such dignity is the particular and unique *grace* that rests upon the human creature. Can the grace be diminished, refused, squandered? Indeed it can, because a certain freedom is necessary to our God-likeness. A mysterious freedom is inherent in human dignity. Sin, idolatry, hardness of heart: these are the names of that dark refusal by which the human being abandons the gift of God-likeness. This, of course, is no abstract possibility. The "fall" from dignity marks the history of every generation.

### *Christ our Dignity and Destiny . .*

However the Gospel of Jesus Christ proclaims the Creator's refusal to abandon the gift of God-likeness. In Jesus Christ, the true Image and Likeness of God appears and is lifted up in our midst. Only so can we begin to *see what love the Father has shown us, that we should be called the Children of God.*

**Small Christian Community Faith Sharing**

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

**Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Oct. 22, 2017 - Matt. 22:15-21**


The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax." Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

**Commentary:**

Conflict and sarcasm are part of the conversation between Jesus and the Pharisees. Both conflict and sarcasm can be difficult to deal with, yet Jesus does not shy away from either. Ironically, it is the sarcasm that speaks the greatest truth: Jesus is unwaveringly truthful and he addressed the conflict head-on. He has clarity about what is central - God and his kingdom - living a good and holy life - and so he is able to give to God what belongs to God: his very self. Would that we have clarity about our life and duties as Jesus portrays in the gospel! So, keeping our eyes on Jesus, we gain clarity, giving to Caesar (government) what is due, as Jesus did, and giving to God, our very selves, living Gospel lives, loving, truthful, good and honest lives, for God's greater honor and glory.


**Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?



Life is valuable, even when it is unwanted, even when it is physically imperfect. Our society has a responsibility to defend the vulnerable and the weak. Our nation should set a goal that unborn children should be welcomed to life and protected in law.
