“Share the Journey”

“In Genesis, God calls on Abraham to abandon his home and migrate to a new land. Later, Jacob and the Israelites follow Joseph to Egypt, migrants escaping a famine in their homeland. In the Book of Exodus, the tribes of Israel flee Egypt and wander in the desert for 40 years, refugees in search of the Promised Land.”

This early history of migration had a profound impact on the Israelites. Hospitality was a prized virtue, and in Leviticus, the people were told that they must love the foreigner in their midst: ‘When an alien resides with you in your land, do not mistreat such a one. You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; you shall love the alien as yourself; for you too were once aliens in the land of Egypt.’” *Welcoming the Refugee and Migrant*

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Nov. 12, 2017 - Matt. 25:1-13

Jesus told his disciples this parable: “The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil. . . .the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. At midnight, there was a cry, “Behold the bridegroom! Come out to meet him! While the foolish virgins went off to buy oil, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards, the other virgins came and said, ‘Lord, Lord, open the door for us!’ But he said in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.’ Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.”

Commentary:

Jesus tells a parable that urges people to be ready for the end time when God’s Kingdom will come completely. The delayed arrival of the groom is the delayed Second Coming of Jesus. People must not be lulled into carelessness, into thinking that it will never happen. It will and we do not know when. The theme of this parable is that the wise are prepared to complete the task. The oil in today’s passage is the good works done for others. We must be prepared by living according to the gospel, doing good for others.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
