It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to His Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take His departure from His own in his visible form, He wanted to give us His sacramental presence; since He was about to offer Himself on the cross to save us, He wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which He loved us “to the end,” even to the giving of His life. In His Eucharistic presence He remains mysteriously in our midst as the One who loved us and gave Himself up for us, and He remains under signs that express and communicate His love.

What to do in Adoration?

1. Meditate using Scripture. Choose a passage from the Bible. Read the words and ask God what He wishes you to draw from that passage.
2. Read the life of a saint and pray with her or him. Most holy women and men have had a great devotion to Our Lord in the Eucharist. Therese of Lisieux, Catherine of Siena, Francis of Assisi, Thomas Aquinas, Peter Julian Eymard, Dorothy Day, Teresa of Calcutta and Baroness Catherine de Hueck are just a few read about them and pray their prayers before the Blessed Sacrament.

Adoration is held every Friday in the Chapel after the 9:00 am Mass until 12 Noon. All are encouraged to take part.

What is the Catholic Strong Campaign ?

Catholic Strong, the campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey, is an effort to raise a minimum of \$50 million in gifts and pledges. **Seventy percent (70%) of all dollars collected up to the parish's goal will be used to support the needs defined by each parish.** Every parish in the diocese has been assigned a financial target to reach in order to meet both the needs of the parish and specific needs of the Diocese, which will be funded with the remaining 30% raised.

For Our Children

Religious Education classes are closed and will resume in September.

Registration forms for 2018-19 are available on the parish's website, stthomasmorenj.org

Children who are being registered for first grade need to provide proof of Baptism unless baptized here at St. Thomas More.

New or transferring families need to register in the parish and at the same time the children may be registered for RE, using the appropriate form, and providing the Baptism and other sacraments certificates for the child/children as well as transfer documents from the previous parish. For more information stop by or call the RE office during the day 9-2, Monday to Thursday. Closed Friday. The preparation for the Sacraments requires a two-year formation. Attending first grade is thus a pre-requisite before entering second grade and to prepare and receive the sacraments of First Penance and Eucharist. The same is said for the seventh grade which is followed by eighth grade and Confirmation.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 15, 2018 - Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two... "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Commentary:

The Twelve are sent to the towns of Galilee. It is a trial mission that looks ahead to the Christian mission, our mission, to the world at large. All Christians (and that includes us) are to speak for God in the world by word and/or deed, even when the world does not care to listen. Jesus tells the Twelve, and he tells us, to get moving on this mission right away. We are to travel lightly. Jesus gives us what is needed: his authority and his teaching. All depends on Jesus: the call, the sending, and what is needed to carry on the mission.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
