Holy Hour– What is That?

The purpose of this special hour is to spend time in prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. We can do many things during a Holy Hour. Venerable Fulton Sheen tells us that with each Holy Hour we do, in a way, we undo the first failed Holy Hour of the disciples when our Lord said to them: “Could you not keep watch one hour with me?” In our Holy Hours we keep vigil with the Lord.

What to do in Adoration

1. Pour out your heart to Christ and adore Him. Speak to Jesus, aware that you are in His presence, and tell Him all that comes to your mind. Listen for His response. Pray the prayer that St. Francis instructed his brothers to pray whenever they were before the Blessed Sacrament: “I adore You, O Christ, present here and in all the churches of the world, for by your holy cross You have redeemed the world.”
2. Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others. Think of those who have hurt you and request a special blessing for them. Ask God to forgive you for all the times you have neglected or hurt someone else. Bring before the Blessed Sacrament all those who have asked you to pray for them. Ask the Lord to address their concerns.

Adoration is held every Friday in the Chapel after the 9:00 am Mass until 12 Noon. All are encouraged to take part.

How different we are from the Apostles who took nothing when they ventured out to serve God. Today, we make our life's journey more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. When we really live in **Stewardship** putting God

first in everything, and money and possessions second, we experience more freedom to joyfully serve God and others.



Frequently Asked Questions

Are gifts to the campaign tax deductible?

Yes. Pledge payments are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law.

Are donors able to pay pledges using a credit card, debit card, or through automatic withdrawal from a checking or savings account?

Yes. A donor may fulfill a pledge using a credit card, debit card, or automatic withdrawal from a checking or savings account. Donors simply provide their account information and their authorization on their personalized pledge card.

Why are donors asked to complete a pledge card?

Pledge cards aid in appropriately recording and acknowledging commitments, and in providing donors with a reminder of subsequent payments according to the schedule they request. Donors are asked to sign the pledge card, indicating that they have authorized the terms of the gift indicated on the card. *A pledge card is not a legally binding document.*

Can donors make gifts of stock or other non-cash gifts?

The campaign accepts gifts of stock and other non-liquid assets, including real estate. Donors wishing to make a gift of stock should follow the stock transfer instructions included in each solicitation packet. Donors wishing to make non-cash gifts should speak with their pastor/pastoral administrator or contact the Diocese of Camden regarding our gift acceptance policy.

Donors who are considering a gift from a donor advised fund, or those considering an estate gift, should contact Jim Lanahan, Director of Development at the Diocese of Camden, by calling 856.583.6125.

Who should donors make checks payable to?

All contributions should be made payable to *Catholic Strong*.

How are the campaign expenses currently being paid?

The costs of the campaign are being paid from the diocesan share of the funds collected.

For Our Children

Registrations for 2018-19 are slowly coming in. The forms have been **emailed** to families and are also available on the parish's website, stthomasmorenj.org. Children who are being registered for first grade need to provide proof of Baptism unless baptized here at St. Thomas More. **The preparation for the Sacraments requires a two-year formation.** Attending first grade is thus a pre-requisite before entering second grade to prepare and receive the sacraments of First Penance and Eucharist. The same is said for the seventh grade which is followed by eighth grade and Confirmation. **New or transferring families are welcome among us.** Please register in our parish and at the same time register the children for religious formation/education. The following attachments need to accompany the registration form: Baptism and other sacramental certificates for the child/children as well as transfer documents from the previous parish or school. FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, JULY 15, 2018

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 22, 2018 - Mark 6:30-34

The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

Commentary:

Jesus looks at the crowd with great feeling. They have no one to feed them with the teaching that will give them life or with the physical food to stay alive. Jesus appreciates how vulnerable people are and how fragile their lives are. Like sheep, they will die without a shepherd to keep them together, show them the way and feed them. Seeing their need, Jesus himself begins to teach. He becomes shepherd to the leaderless flock. Jesus calls his disciples to be the kind of shepherd he is. The disciples, of course, will not understand this kind of leadership until after the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
