An Advent examen on what it means ‘to be parish’

“Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the Lord double for all her sins” (Isaiah 40:1-2).

These words may be the loveliest words in Scripture. Notice that these words do not come as a promise. They are delivered as a command, something that Isaiah is to do, and they become God’s word to us, something that we must do as well.

“To be parish is to be a place, to be a people, where God’s command to comfort the other is fulfilled.”

Allow me to describe the cares and concerns of those sitting near you. What is true for us this Advent in 2018 is true every Sunday, in every parish around the world. So reflect for a moment. Call it an Advent examen in preparation for the 12 Days of Christmas. Consider:

Those who are approaching their first Christmas after the death of someone whom they have dearly loved.

Those who come to Christmas to celebrate the Word made flesh, knowing that cancer or some other disease has invaded their own flesh.

Those who, advanced in age, live in fear that this will be their last Christmas in their own home, still able to live life in their own way.

Those who want to live in the freedom of Christ but are still held captive by addiction.

Those who try to spread holiday cheer and comfort, all the while returning to homes where discord and distrust reign.

Those who are alienated from their family and friends, cut off from the faces meant to give them life.

Those who think that they are alone in struggling with unbelief and with questions about their faith.

Those who are not here in the parish most Sundays because it has never been a place of comfort for them.

If a face or two has come before your mind, realize that God has given you a gift. You have seen the suffering of God’s cherished ones. Now it is up to you to decide how to make this command of God into the promise of your parish.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 23, 2018 – Luke 1:39-45

Mary traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Commentary:

The prime example of preferring God's will to our own plans is Mary of Nazareth. A young girl with her whole life ahead of her, a teenager with dreams like any other, Mary found her personal plans in disarray the moment the angel showed up in her chamber. Yet Mary trusted God's plan over her own, and when she flew to the side of her older cousin, she greeted another woman who had done the same. The image of these two women falling into each other's arms is celebrated as the perfect response of joy between true believers. Many will attend church this holiday season, but few will give their lives over to the will of God as Mary and Elizabeth did. But if you and I choose to become such people, we will share in the dance of these two cousins and know their joy. Merry Christmas!

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

The Georgian Institute How to Pray a Holy Hour

There is no one way to pray a holy hour. The following might help if you get lost in the hour, but feel free to reconfigure it to suit your needs.



First 5 minutes: Ask the Holy Spirit to help you, then make acts of faith, hope and charity. Tell God how you believe, trust and love Him. Ask for more faith, hope and love.

Next 10 minutes: Adore God. He holds the universe like a seed in the palm of His hand. He is all powerful, all good, more beautiful than we can imagine, and more real than the small things that we grasp so easily. Imagine Christ sitting with you. Tell Him: "Oh, my God, I adore your divine greatness from the depths of my littleness, you are so great, and I am so small." or "Glory be..." Repeat as long as necessary. (More to come next week)
