Mary, Mother of God: The Christmas Doctrine of Love

Called in the Gospels “mother of Jesus,” Mary is acclaimed by Elizabeth, at the prompting of the Spirit, and even before the birth of Mary’s son, as “the mother of my Lord” (Lk. 2:43). In fact, the One whom she conceived as man by the Holy Spirit, who truly became her son according to the flesh, was none other than the Father’s eternal Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity. Hence the Church confesses that Mary is truly “Mother of God” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 499).

The title, *Theotokos* (“God Bearer”) was officially promulgated at the Council of Ephesus in 449. The fathers of the council were simply confirming the established practice of the Church east and west. The council was simply following the logic of the Faith in Jesus Christ as *truly God and truly man*. For, as the Catechism makes clear, “what the Catholic faith believes about Mary is based on what it believes about Christ, and what it teaches about Mary illumines in turn its faith in Christ” (no. 47). This explains how it is that Lutheran, Anglican, and Presbyterian communities, with other Christian fellowships, have always joined in affirming this Marian title

How is it that the Church’s meditation on the divine motherhood of Mary “illumines . . . its faith in Christ”? First of all, Mary’s role opens the eyes of faith to the unfathomable humility of God. When God sends his eternal Son to be born of a woman mother, the Son takes to himself our humanity. Just so, “The Father of mercies willed that the Incarnation should be preceded by the *assent* of the chosen God Bearer” (Vat. II).

To speak of the revelation of God’s “lowliness” is to speak of the revelation of God’s love. And to speak of the love of the incarnate Son of God is to speak of the love of his human mother. For motherhood is not simply a biological role; it is not only an act of “reproduction”. Motherhood is, by its created nature, a calling forth of a new origination of love—love of the mother for her child and the child for the mother. In the womb, the reality of love is already present. In the first moments after birth, the child will “search” for love and find it at the mother’s breast. The child will not have to “learn” to love the mother. The mother and child simply “answer” to the love of the other.

As fully human, the baby Jesus will “reach” for love: love prepared, love given, love received. In the Incarnation, human love is destined to be perfected by divine Love. If there was to be the Incarnation, there had to be the *Mother* of God.

***Convocation of Catholic Leaders
The Joy of the Gospel in South Jersey***

At this moment in time, when our hearts are burdened with so many difficult issues, the Holy Spirit is guiding the Diocese of Camden on a mission. This mission, *The Convocation of Catholic Leaders: The Joy of the Gospel in South Jersey*, will give lay leaders from throughout the diocese the opportunity to reflect on the reality that the Catholic Church finds herself in today. In March 2019, participants will gather for workshops, reflection, prayer and discussion. These 650+ lay leaders chosen from each of the parishes in the diocese, will take what they have learned back to their parishes and communities and address today's challenges as a diverse community of missionary disciples.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for The Epiphany of the Lord, January 6, 2019 – Matthew 2:1-12


When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, “Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.” ...After their audience with Herod, they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. ...They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Commentary:

Epiphany means “manifestation,” a revelation of Jesus as truly God. Matthew and Luke show this child to be divine through stories of “signs and wonders” when Jesus was an infant. Matthew’s account of the visit of the three magi also shows the Church’s mission to the Gentiles. Matthew’s audience, largely Jewish Christians, was struggling to accept the presence of Gentile Christians in their community. Matthew shows in this Gospel passage that the salvation of Gentiles (symbolized by the foreign Magi) as well as Jews was indeed God’s plan.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?




Pro-Life Corner: The only difference between the Herod of old and the “Herods” of today are in the weapons used and the number of victims. Herod used swords and spears to kill the Holy Innocents. Today’s Herods use surgical abortion, “the Pill,” and other chemical weapons. And whereas Herod killed a relatively small number of babies, today’s Herods have butchered, worldwide, hundreds of millions with no end in sight!

Special Collections for 2019

In response to ongoing concerns expressed regarding the number of mandatory collections takes each year, the Diocese will be conducting an experiment to see if the number of National Collections can be reduced. **The proposal is to combine collections of a similar nature and purpose. Throughout 2019, the Diocese will be monitoring the results.** It is the hope and expectation of the Diocesan Offices that by combining collections, some of the burden and concerns will be reduced without a detrimental impact on the amount of needed funds collected for these important purposes.
