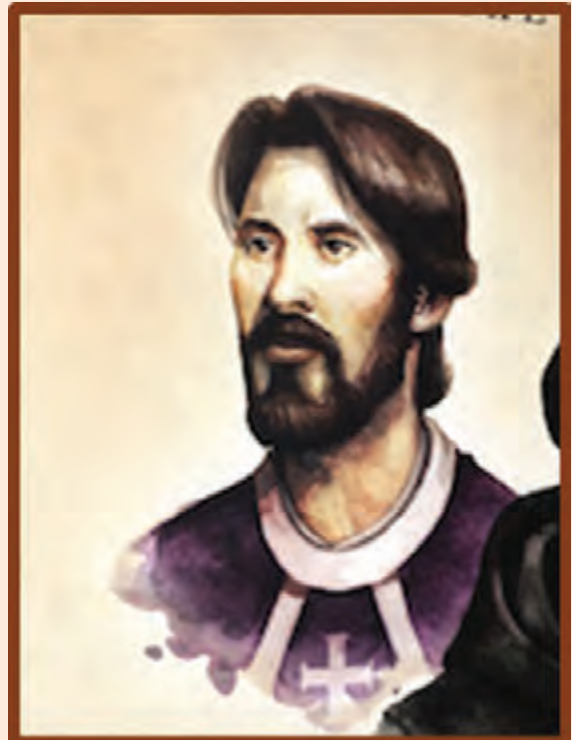

#### Convocation of Catholic Leaders: The Joy of the Gospel in South Jersey

As the Catholic community in South Jersey prepares for this historic convocation, we invite everyone to spend some time reading and reflecting on Pope Francis’ apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)*, which is the foundational document for the gathering. In the weeks leading up to the convocation, we will share a selection of quotations from the Holy Father’s beautiful, powerful exhortation.

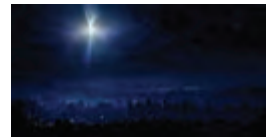

### The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord From the USCCB



**Read:** The Epiphany marks the arrival of visitors, identified in Scripture as the magi, to the place where Jesus was born. Although we know virtually nothing about them, we do know they brought three gifts:

1. Gold—a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king;
2. Frankincense—the crystallized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, symbolic of prayer;
3. Myrrh—another resinous tree sap and an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.

**Reflect:** For much of the secular world, the holiday season has died down. Reflect with this article on the joys of the holiday season and what you have left to celebrate when the decorations are put away.

**Pray:** "Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. May Jesus Christ dwell with us, keep us from harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. Amen."

**Act:** Wish someone a Merry Christmas today! An easy way to evangelize is to wish someone a Merry Christmas during the Christmas season after December 25th and explain why. The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### **Excerpt from the Gospel for The Baptism of the Lord, January 13, 2019 – Luke 3:15-16**

The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

#### **Commentary:**

The Gospel speaks to us about allowing God to be God and remembering that we are here to discern God's Will in our lives. Jesus comes to John the Baptist and asks for Baptism. John is worried that he is not worthy to baptize Jesus. This concern of John's is holding up the revelation God wants to make! Jesus tells John to "allow it" – to let God be God for now. Once John gets out of the way, the voice from heaven can be heard plainly.

#### **Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
