

# **Introducing the Revised Roman Missal**

# "Institution Narrative"

The Institution Narrative—sometimes called the **consecration** — is the moment during Mass when we hear again the story of the first Eucharist: the story of how Jesus gave his disciples his own Body and Blood in bread and wine on that last night before he died. The priest lifts up the chalice filled with wine and says: "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, / for this is the chalice of my Blood, / the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many / for the forgiveness of sins." Chalice is not a word we use in ordinary speech, but is a word we tend to reserve for the Eucharist. A second change is from "for all" to "for many." Of course, this doesn't represent a change in our belief about the saving mission of Christ, who "takes away the sins of the world" (Invitation to Communion). Rather, it is a more faithful rendering of the Latin pro multis, and reflects the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper according to Mark and Matthew.

# **A SPIRITUAL JOURNEY**

I am often asked the question "Father, how did you ever become a priest?" Well, it is not easy to reconstruct the past because there is always the temptation to read into the past something which was not there. Yet, I think it is fair to say that my childhood and early life experiences, with the grace of God, had a great impact on my choice to become a priest.

I grew up very close to nature and to God on a mixed farm in Ireland. There cows, sheep, pigs, horses and hens were raised. Milking the cows each morning before going to school and feeding the sheep each afternoon were done with the regularity of a paperboy doing his route in the neighborhood in this country.

The frequent trips on the tractor with my dad as he drove through the farm or went to the local market were always prefaced with a very deliberate sign of the cross on the forehead, which was a reminder that I lived and moved and had my being in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

My mom's commitment to the First Friday devotion of Mass and Holy Communion in hail, rain and snow was a concrete visible sign of her commitment and fidelity to the great gift of the Eucharist. Both my parents seemed to integrate prayer into the daily life of the family. The family Rosary was a part of the daily regime. Sunday worship was never missed. May Crownings and Corpus Christi Processions as well as Altar Server outings were annual events for me.

My neighbors next door were exceptional people. Our families were very close emotionally and geographically. There were three of them in a small thatched cabin. A widowed mother in her seventies along with her son and daughter who were in their fifties. They lived very simply on very little. They were an enmeshed family, but they seemed to cope very well. They were extremely nurturing and supportive of my siblings and me.

My neighbors had an old, well-used Bible from which they would read about the life of Christ. They would talk about the kind of person He was; the stories He told; the way He treated people. They were very familiar with the Gospel stories and with the life of Jesus.

My neighbors seemed very content and very happy to manage a small farm, read the Bible and say two Rosaries daily. The morning Rosary was for world peace and the long Rosary in the evening was for the family. They were special and I always felt special and unique in their home.

My childhood experiences and programming helped me realize very early in life that there was a God and that I had one life to live and one journey to walk. I wanted that journey and walk to be the best possible. This early conditioning also enhanced for me the priestly lifestyle. So that the apparent dramatic decision to enter the seminary was the outgrowth of a whole series of childhood experiences, happenings and events at home, on the farm and in the wider Christian Community.

My childhood experiences affected my life choices. Even though much of my time now is spent doing the same kind of work as other professionals like counseling, comforting, helping, teaching, budgeting and managing-there is one big difference. I do it all for someone. That Someone is Jesus. God's grace was quietly, and in hidden way, flowing throughout my decisions and movements.

"When you have abandoned all things that hamper the human heart;

When you have sought Him alone and have been together with Christ from morning till night;

When you have had Him alone as guide for your heart;

When in everything you are in Him and for Him, then you can tell yourself: I am a priest."

# Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for the proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 21, 2011 - Matt. 16:13-20 Jesus said to his disciples, "but who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it..."

# Commentary:

The Children can be solidly built only on the person of Jesus. The Church can stand firmly only by faith in Jesus. The Church is a community of disciples which acknowledges that Jesus is "the Christ (Messiah), the Son of the living God." Peter's recognition of Jesus is a revelation from God. Thus, the Church comes into being through divine revelation. The builder of the Church is Jesus himself and the Church is his: "I will build my church" (16:18). The Church is unintelligible apart from the revelation of God and the work of Jesus. These divine origins account for the Church's ability to withstand the power of the netherworld and death (16:18).

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
