**Bring Your Children to Mass**  
**Liturgy of the Word for Children**  
**Jesus said, “*Let the children come to Me.*”**



Little children need to attend Mass with their parents. This weekly practice becomes a habit that carries over into adulthood. It is a good thing.

However, young children who attend Mass with their parents cannot be expected to understand the Sunday Scripture passages as they are read and explained.

St. Thomas More Parish offers a program entitled : “*Liturgy of the Word for Children.*” Following the Opening Prayer of the 10:00 am Mass on all Sundays through May 5, 2019, the celebrant will invite all children present, ages three through first grade, to come to the front of the church to meet their catechists. Parents of these children will not accompany the children. If a child will not go on his/her own, they are not ready. *Please send your young children only if they feel comfortable leaving you.*

The catechists will then take the children from the church to a classroom where the children will listen to the Sunday Gospel in a language that is understandable to them. The children will sing songs and do activities appropriate for their age levels. Following the Our Father and during the Sign of Peace, the children will be escorted back into the church to re-join their families for the remainder of the Mass.

The readings of this week are so full of content and messages, all leading us to deeper reflection on who we are and who JESUS is. His own hometown, His own kinsmen did not recognize Him as the “Possible Messiah”, much awaited for hundreds of generations. He did not say what they wanted to hear, or act as they wanted Him to act. So, they rejected him. They wanted a messiah that would lead them to be a big nation among the other nations, and even be over all the nations. They seemed to have no interest in who HE was claiming to be. Their interest in things spiritual had declined so much, they did not want or understand a spiritual kingdom. They refused their own identity as the Chosen people of God, living alongside other nations and people. They missed the whole point. Does this describe us and our social context?



Jesus is still real and no one will get HIM over the cliff, rather he is there, saving us from the cliff’s drop. Are we able to hear him?

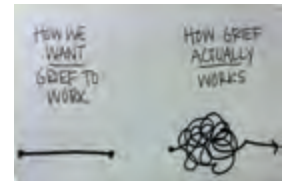

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 10, 2019 – Luke 5:1-11

(Jesus was preaching to a large crowd. He saw a boat nearby and got into the boat to preach. The boat happened to belong to Simon.) "After Jesus had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch.' Simon said in reply, 'Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets.' When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, 'Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man.' Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men.' When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed Jesus."

#### Commentary:

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus calling the first disciples. Jesus calls unlikely, even unworthy people to follow him, but in response to his assurance of forgiveness, we see a generous response to the call. Even Peter, first among the apostles, is first astonished at the power of Jesus and then overcome by a sense of his own sinfulness. But Jesus overlooks Peter's protests that he is unworthy and calls him beyond that to reach out to others.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
