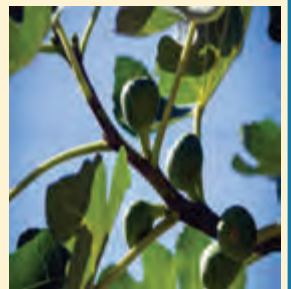

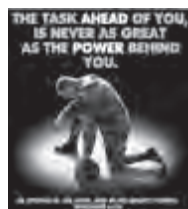
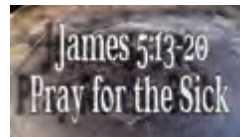

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 31, 2019 – Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

(The parable of the Prodigal Son)

While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. The son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son." (The father ordered a feast to celebrate the young son's return. The older son, on hearing about the feast grew angry and jealous. He had been faithful and had no party. His younger brother had strayed from home and now was being rewarded with a feast). The father said to the older son, "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found."

Commentary:

Jesus says to the prodigal in all of us: "You do have a father like this. He is waiting for you to find yourself, your true self made in his image and likeness, and come on home. Never mind where you've been or what you did. The most important thing is who you are: a child of God. There's not a thing you can do to lose that identity. The party waits for you."

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

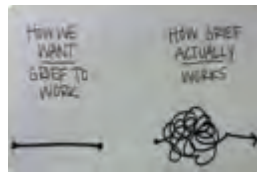

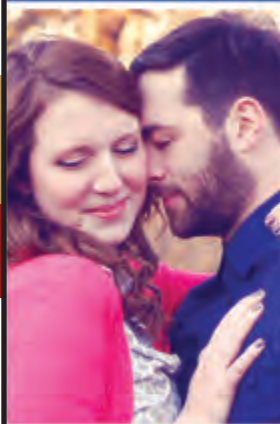
