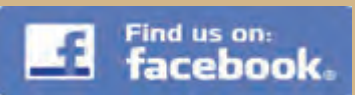

What Happened at the Convocation of Catholic Leaders? March 25-28 Atlantic City

The Diocese of Camden's Convocation of Catholic Leaders: Joy of the Gospel in South Jersey took place March 25-28 at Harrah's Conference Center in Atlantic City. Father Phillip Johnson, Sister Ann Byrnes, along with the nine parishioners who comprise the Saint Thomas More Parish Delegation gathered with the 63 other parish pastors and their delegations for four days of engaging speakers, inspiring witness, prayer, worship, music, and dialogue on creating a culture of missionary discipleship.

Delegates represented different heritages, backgrounds, ages and viewpoints — including young and seasoned lay leaders and parishioners who have gifts and talents yet to be tapped. Each delegate's journey to the convocation involved a commitment of completing extensive pre-work and attending meetings over a 5-week period. The majority of our Saint Thomas More Delegation have full and part-time jobs. They made sacrifices to participate, but all felt the importance of being called to represent our parish family for this special opportunity.

The first day of the convocation was held, not coincidentally, on the feast of the Annunciation. Bishop Dennis Sullivan expressed the hope that all gathered would, like Mary, give an affirming "yes" to birthing Christ in our world... *"may what happens here this week strengthen, build up, direct, encourage, refresh and renew our church."*

The entire Convocation experience was an emphatic call to missionary discipleship. Parish Delegations were encouraged to use creative thinking, openness in dialogue and to envision new ways the local church can proclaim the Gospel in the future. The 4 days of events included respected speakers, interactive workshops, a Eucharistic celebration, and praise and worship. Featured speakers were Cardinal Joseph Tobin of Newark; Julianne Stanz, director of Discipleship and Leadership Development in the Diocese of Green Bay, Wisconsin; Hosffman Ospino of Boston College, School of Theology and Ministry; Carolyn Y. Woo of Purdue University; Chris Lowney, Vice-Chair of Commonwealth Health and author of *Everyone Leads, How to Revitalize the Catholic Church*.

The Convocation had a profound effect both spiritually and practically on our understanding of missionary responsibility. That mission can only be accomplished if we encourage YOU, our St. Thomas More parish family, to collaborate with us in new ways for the future of the church Jesus has given us. After the Lenten season, we will share with you our ideas. *Our primary goal, with the Holy Spirit's guidance, is to inspire each other, reach out to families, and get young people involved. In the weeks ahead, TOGETHER let us share in the mission to create a culture of encounter with others that makes our church more alive, welcoming, and active!*

Sessions Coming Up: April 9, 16, 30; May 7

IMPORTANT DATES: CONFIRMATION, May 3, 5:00 pm – FIRST EUCHARIST, May 5, at the 11:30 Mass

This past week we held the “Sandwich making night”. We made our goal of **425 sandwiches in about 45 minutes**. *We enjoyed the camaraderie and the feeling of solidarity which came from each person present. Some comments from the children; “We need to do this again!” “I did not realize how much fun this could be.” “I am glad we did this; to feed the hungry, is the first Corporal Work of Mercy.” We can learn important lessons by listening to our children, which may make us think about the authenticity of our words and actions.*

Our present world culture is soaked in relativism, the view that truth is relative to a particular context and is not absolute; that truth varies from person to person, time to time, culture to culture and that there are no absolutes.



Thus, it is up to each person to decide what is convenient and enhances one’s own plans, VS. what is the right thing to do, and **WHAT WOULD JESUS DO**. Living a virtuous life may be a real challenge, and we may very well be tempted to modify our belief and the truth, rather than change our behavior, and grow in virtue and holiness, committed to God’s love. In the Gospel of today, Jesus does not condone sin. He points to honest self-examine. What if the accusers were guilty of the same sin? Jesus’ powerful words: “Neither do I condemn you, and from here on do not sin anymore.” What a powerful lesson for us to carry to our children; to seek the truth, live up to it in forgiveness; rise up to a life of virtue and holiness.

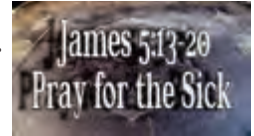

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, March 20, 2016 – Luke 22:14-23:56

(The Passion according to Luke)

“After arresting Jesus, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest; Peter was following at a distance. They lit a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat around it, and Peter sat down with them. When a maid saw Peter seated in the light, she looked intently at him and said, ‘This man too was with him.’ But he denied it saying, ‘Woman, I do not know him.’ A short while later someone else saw Peter and said, ‘You too are one of them’; but Peter answered, ‘My friend, I am not.’ About an hour later, still another insisted, ‘Assuredly, this man too was with him, for he also is a Galilean.’ But Peter said, ‘My friend, I do not know what you are talking about.’ Just as he was saying this, the cock crowed, and the Lord turned and looked at Peter; and Peter remembered the words of the Lord, how he had said to him, ‘Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times. Peter went out and began to weep bitterly.’”

Commentary:

On the way to Calvary, Jesus continues to call the people to repent, to change their hearts. Jesus continues to reach out and forgive, even from the cross. He forgives Peter and his killers, and offers salvation to the repentant thief. Jesus dies as he lives, the obedient and faithful servant of God. Because of this, Jesus is raised up in the kingdom.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

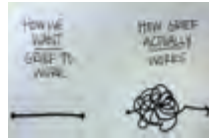
