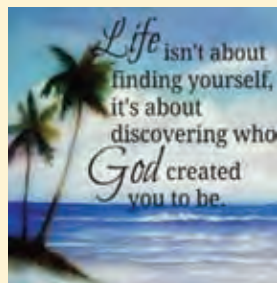
Facing the truth is always a hard thing. But, once we make a habit of facing IT regularly, we can't do otherwise and we find great peace and joy in the process.

When we seek Truth we actually end up finding God's will for us and our way of thinking changes.

Being able to see the TRUTH and FACE it is the only way to righteousness in our actions and honest LOVE for others.

The second reading today, along with the Gospel, deserves our attention.

Paul does not mince words. But to today's culture he may sound outrageous. We are bombarded by the media and advertising. We can hardly know where the truth is. If we allow the news media and the advertising to tell us who we are, how we should be or how we should look at the world we will never see the truth. As Paul says: "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work." **Reading and Praying with Holy Scripture is the way to find GOD and HIS loving plan for us.**

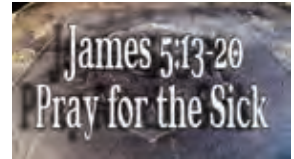

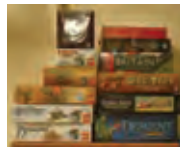

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

The Gospel for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 27, 2019 - Luke 18:9-14


Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. “Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, ‘O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity - greedy, dishonest, adulterous - or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.’ But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, ‘O God, be merciful to me a sinner.’ I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.”

Commentary:

Most of us grew up seeking rewards for a “job well done.” Most of us desire the affirmation of a pleasant reward at the end of a hard work week. Is it surprising that we want the same affirmation from God that we’re doing a good job keeping the commandments and following the rules of life? But the truth is; we don’t have to seek God’s approval. We’re already loved beyond imagination, and forgiven beyond reason. All we have to do is what that humble tax collector does: admit that we are sinners. That won’t make God mad. It makes us eligible for God’s mercy.

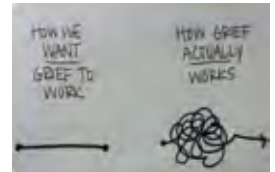
1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?

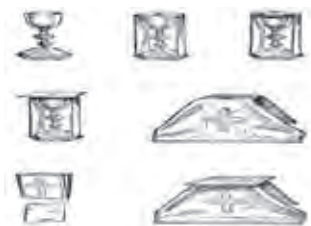
