The Faith & Justice Team will be using the Weekly Bulletin to share information about Catholic Social Teaching. Below is listed the Seven Principle Themes of the Church's Teaching on Justice Issues.

1 LIFE AND DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

Every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, every person's life and dignity must be respected and supported from conception through natural death. We believe that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

2 CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY AND PARTICIPATION

The human person is not only sacred, but social. How we organize our society — socially, economically, legally and politically — directly affects human dignity and the ability of every human person to grow in community. Marriage and family, the foundations for social life, should be strengthened and supported.

3 SOLIDARITY

We are one human family. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they may be. Loving our neighbor has global dimensions. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace. Our love for all of our brothers and sisters calls us to seek a peaceful and just society.

4 DIGNITY OF WORK

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation.

5 RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Every person has a fundamental right to life — the right that makes all other rights possible. Each person also has a right to the conditions for living a decent life — food, health care, housing, education and employment.

6 OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

Scripture teaches that God has a special concern for the poor and vulnerable. The Church calls on all of us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable should be reflected in both our daily lives and public policies.

7 CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION

The world that God created has been entrusted to all of us. Our stewardship of the earth is a form of participation in God's act of creating and sustaining the world. In our use of creation, we must be guided by a concern for generations to come. We show our respect for the Creator by our care for creation.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 16, 2020 - Matthew 5:17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the Kingdom of heaven. "You have heard it said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill' ...but I say to you, whoever is angry with brother or sister will be liable to judgment." "You have heard it said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery in his heart." "Your ancestors said, 'Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow.' But I say to you, do not swear at all."

Commentary:

One by one, Jesus takes the various laws, in all their externality and draws out their inner roots. One injunction had been against killing. But the inside of that law is, do not ever act out of anger for your brother (or sister). Not even the word 'raqa' [vain or worthless fellow] may be spoken. You shall not commit adultery. The inside of that law is, be pure enough to not even look lustfully at a woman. And, divorce. The interior law is to stay faithful and loving within your marriage relationship. Finally, the matter of oaths and swearing. Jesus diagnoses this simply: you are trying to make up for your weakness by putting almighty power behind your words. Just say yes or no, and mean it. Why does Jesus dig so deep? The inside of the law is written in Jesus' heart. May it be written in ours as well.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
