

CHURCH IS GOOD MEDICINE FOR BODY AND SOUL

Young and old came in great numbers on Christmas morning. They were motivated to come by inner longings that were both conscious and unconscious. But, the good news was that they came that morning thirsting for a spiritual overhaul.

They came to worship God. They came to seek God. They came to find God. They came looking for God. They came to ask God. They came to praise God. They came to heal their broken hearts and their empty souls.

They came with inner hungers to connect with the Lord. It may have been unconscious but many wanted a deeper union with their Lord. They passionately desired that new life over which death has no power anymore. They wanted to celebrate the continued living presence of Jesus in time.

They came with their hidden wounds in their hearts. They came with unrevealed and unexposed wounds. They came with secret and silent wounds. They came with infected and negative wounds. They came with bitter and cruel wounds. They came with family inflicted wounds. They came with incurable diseases and unavoidable divorces.

In the narthex of our church, one woman said she was returning to her spiritual roots. Her early child-hood conditioning was not good. Yet, when she was a child, the figure of Jesus was very powerful for her. Then as an adolescent, she rebelled against everything.

For years, she had great anger toward God. She stopped going to church altogether. She never expanded her religious knowledge. Her knowledge of the faith was remarkable shallow. Her insecurities and her anxieties made her sharp-tongued and over-direct. She could convey scorn and judgment with ease. She alienated just about everyone.

For a long time she felt unaccepted and alone in the world. She is now trying to cut through the underlying beliefs and self-defeating thought patterns that have kept her from changing her life. She now sees herself making a commitment to honestly examining her beliefs about herself, God and Sunday worship.

In our brief exchange, the words poured easily out of her mouth. She made the comments that "I have struggled to quit drinking... I am attempting to upgrade my shallow religious knowledge... I did not rekindle my interest in spirituality until my late forties... my religion really does matter to me now...I have great human and divine yearnings...I went back to church on Christmas Day and continue on Sunday mornings..."

Clinical studies done at Duke University on church attendance are remarkable. These studies have shown that church attendance is good for your health. Those who had high church attendance had lower blood pressure than those who attended church infrequently.

Even when lifestyle factors and genetic factors were taken into account, the findings were the same. High church attendance meant lower blood pressure. High church attendance meant an overall better quality of life.



SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 15, 2012

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 22, 2012 - Mark 1:14-20

Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Commentary:

Repent and believe...what do these words really mean? Repent actually is a call to change, a willingness to change my thoughts and ways to those of God. Sometimes change is radical as we see with the disciples who leave their fishing boats and follow Jesus. More often than not, modest changes are more likely, that is, turning our little everyday behaviors, such as impatience, disrespect, gossiping or losing my temper to the more God-like behaviors of patience, respect, holding my tongue and my outbursts. These changes, radical or modest, are evidence of my belief in the Gospel of God, where the final answer is "love" and the gift I receive is God's presence, with me, for me and through me.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
