HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

It was a cold November day. The cold gale force winds were blowing across the green fields. The time for delivery had arrived. The midwife came to our home and was able to make a well-informed decision about the birth process.

Of course, the midwife had already known that there were no irregularities. Thankfully my mom had an enjoyable, safe and healthy gestation. It was a safe and natural childbirth. The delivery room was right there in our country home. I was born into the warmth of my own home.

Giving birth and bringing new life into the world is one of the most challenging and sacred tasks that any human being can achieve. My mom like most married women of that time did not deny herself the pleasures of conception.

It was early in the morning that her third child was born. He was received with ecstatic joy. She said that giving birth was much easier the third time around. It was less daunting. She had a self-confidence, courage and determination that she just did not have two and half years earlier.

Mom had a breastfeeding relationship with all of her children. This nursing experience of resting my head on her breast was my primary source of comfort during the first few months of my life. This intimate exchange set up a powerful intimate and complex connection with my mom. This was followed with months of sensitive and gradual child-led weaning.

Like most other mothers at that time, my mom got married with the full intention to have children. She wanted to become a mother. She wanted to experience the joys of co-creating with God and watching her children grow and mature.

In all likelihood my mom unconsciously wanted to be re-introduced to the innocence of her own childhood. She wanted the opportunity to introduce her offspring to the beauty of God's creation. She wanted to guide, teach and parent along-side my dad.

Like most other mothers she was not prepared for the sleepless nights. She was not ready for the myriad household chores that needed to be done. Her life was busy with preparing meals, washing the dishes, doing the laundry, mending tattered clothes and changing diapers. Her life was busy helping anyone and everyone navigate the inevitable hurdles of daily living on the farm.

Like most other mothers she was not ready for the messes and the constant repetitions that are part of child rearing. She was not ready for the many distractions and the lack of time for herself. She was not ready for the demanding task of just being there for all the big "milestones" like the *first words* and the *first steps* in the lives of her children.

Yet, I believe that the slow-paced life on the farm although very busy gave her lots of time to reflect on the ultimate meaning of life. She had her own special practices and meditations. There was always time for Sunday worship, the family rosary and visits to the Knock shrine. She had her own special prayer style and at the same time she knew full well that motherhood was her primary path to God.

My mom was very committed to doing the different novenas that are immersed in the liturgical calendar. It was her zest for spirituality that deepened her appreciation for the mystery of life. Through her awareness of the omnipresence of God her everyday activities became her path to God. It was her belief in the power of prayer that enabled her to remain centered in the midst of the sometimes rather chaotic demands of family life.

Like Saint Teresa and many of the saints my mom enjoyed nature. She loved working with the soil. Planting a spring garden always turned out to be relaxing and a sheer fertile experience. She was always happy sowing bulbs and seeds and waiting for the outcomes. She could hardly wait for those bulbs to show their gorgeous blooms. She was especially happy when the daffodils, tulips and gladioli came back to life every spring. She loved rose bushes and any flowering shrub.

My mom was always grateful for any acts of kindness. She loved attention of any kind. She loved a phone call or any caring, empathic connection with her. She was always glad to receive flowers from the garden or any source at all. Encouragement and support helped her deal better with the twists and turns of mothering.

My mom was forever grateful for a card or a visit. She especially liked simple cards that were made by her children or grandchildren. She was always welcoming of sentiments of appreciation and gratitude. She savored the good memories and the good times. I knew deep down in my soul that she was always proud of any good news about me or other family members.

This weekend we celebrate Mother's Day. This is the time to say a heartfelt *thank you mom*. We buy cards. We make phone calls. We give flowers. We dine out. We speak nice words of thankfulness. Happy Mother's Day!

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - MAY 13, 2012

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Seventh Sunday of Easter, May 20, 2012 - John 17:11-19

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed, saying: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one. When I was with them I protected them...but now I am coming to you. I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth. Your word is truth.

Commentary:

As Jesus prepares to return to the Father, he consecrates the disciples (and us) to be his continuing presence in the world. Even though we are consecrated, we cannot avoid the tension between belonging to Christ and belonging to the world: we will be at odds with the world, but one with each other; we will be confronted with the evil one, but be protected from the evil one. In the midst of this tension we are assured of Jesus' love, prayer, and protection.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
