From the Pastor's Desk

The Pastoral (Parish) Council

Dear Parishioners.

When we examine what **canon** (church) law requires of every parish, we see that a *finance* council is mandated. *Canon 537* states: In each parish there is to be a finance council which is governed, in addition to universal law, by norms issued by the diocesan bishop and in which the Christian faithful, selected according to these same norms, are to assist the pastor in the administration of the goods of the parish This council is established and active here at St. Thomas More Parish and meets regularly attempting to keep our parish operating in a fiscally responsible manner.

Canon law also states the following (<u>Canon 536</u>): 1. If the diocesan bishop judges it opportune after he has heard the Presbyteral council, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides and in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity. 2. A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by the norms established by the diocesan bishop.

Regarding this pastoral council, it has been in a *state of limbo* here since I arrived and needs to be re-established. I am looking for a select group of people (9 to 12 are recommended) to help <u>advise</u> me with various matters concerning the future of the parish.

According to our diocesan guidelines: Parish Pastoral Councils provide a way for pastors to consult their people. The Parish Pastoral Council is: "to examine and consider all that relates to pastoral work and to offer practical conclusions on these matters, so that the life and activity of the People of God may be brought into greater conformity with the Gospel." In this description, we find three tasks assigned to the pastoral council: to examine, to consider, and to recommend.

- *To examine:* The object of the Parish Pastoral Council's examination, "pastoral work," is left sufficiently un-specified in order to include all that concerns the pastor and his staff in serving the parish. The council identifies issues and studies them either at the request of the pastor or on its own initiative.
- *To consider:* The Parish Pastoral Council prayerfully ponders the data it has collected from its examination by trying to discern in what direction God is inviting the parish to go, what is behind the data.

To recommend: After the Parish Pastoral Council has examined and considered any pastoral work, it makes a recommendation to the pastor and his staff on what should be done for this parish at this time in its history.

I am looking for dedicated, prayerful people willing to help me. If <u>you</u> are interested or you wish to recommend someone for this task, please let me know *in writing* or by *e-mail* (<u>fr.namiotka@gmail.com</u>) by **April 30**, **2022**. After prayerful consideration, the council will be re-established *anew* to assist me with the future vision and direction of **St. Thomas More Parish**.

For those who want more information, the diocesan **Parish Pastoral Council Guidelines** in English and Spanish can be found on the diocesan website (<u>www.camdendiocese.org</u>). Please give my request some prayerful deliberation. More information should follow in the months ahead.

Religious Education/Formation to inspire and impart to our children

As Catholics we have a privilege that no other faith or religion has: The sacrament of Confession, Penance, Reconciliation. We are invited to admit our sins, confess them, make up for them and reconcile with those we have hurt or, in some way, we need to draw close to again. It is an unfortunate thing that most Catholics do not appreciate or take advantage of this grace.

In the readings of the 4th Sun. of Lent/C, we can hear God the Father saying, "I want to do something new in **YOU**, letting go of your sinfulness". As his chosen one, God wants to form us more in his own image and likeness, as he intended when our heart first started to beat. It is an amazing thing yet so few of us even stop to think about what it may mean.

St. Paul mentions that he "considered everything as a loss... and much rubbish because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." In the story of the "Adulterous Woman" Jesus intently makes the accusers realize that if she indeed committed the sin, someone else had to be committing the same sin along with her. How easy it may be to point to the sin of others, while covering up for oneself. What important lessons for us as we teach our children honesty sincerity, truthfulness, integrity. We teach best by example accompanied by HOLY words. Do we realize the tremendous responsibility we undertook at Baptism, to nurture their FAITH all along? Parents, heed the invitation to make a resolution to attend to the Sacrament of Confession as a Family before this coming Easter.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, April 10, 2022 Luke 22:14-23:56 (The Passion according to Luke)

"After arresting Jesus, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest; Peter was following at a distance. They lit a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat around it, and Peter sat down with them. When a maid saw Peter seated in the light, she looked intently at him and said, 'This man too was with him.' But he denied it saying, 'Woman, I do not know him.' A short while later someone else saw Peter and said, 'You too are one of them'; but Peter answered, 'My friend, I am not.' About an hour later, still another insisted, 'Assuredly, this man too was with him, for he also is a Galilean.' But Peter said, 'My friend, I do not know what you are talking about.' Just as he was saying this, the cock crowed, and the Lord turned and looked at Peter; and Peter remembered the words of the Lord, how he had said to him, 'Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times. Peter went out and began to weep bitterly."

Commentary:

On the way to Calvary, Jesus continues to call the people to repent, to change their hearts. Jesus continues to reach out and forgive, even from the cross. He forgives Peter and his killers, and offers salvation to the repentant thief. Jesus dies as he lives, the obedient and faithful servant of God. Because of this, Jesus is raised up in the kingdom.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
