#### Stewardship Corner: 3rd Sunday of Lent Joyful Stewardship

"Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again." JOHN 4:13



Jesus reminds his Stewards that material things, even something as basic as water, can never satisfy us over the long run. When we build our lives around material possessions we will always want more and no amount will ever satisfy our desire. True joy and

peace only come when we follow Jesus - when we become more "God-centered" and less "self-centered."



### From the Pastor's Desk Lessons from the "Woman at the Well"

Dear Parishioners,

In this Sunday's Gospel, we have the story of the Samaritan woman at the well (Jn. 4: 5-42). Certainly, there are multiple lessons to be learned from this passage. I focus here on three.

Living Water. Jesus is thirsty and asks the woman for a drink. Their conversation then progresses to Jesus inviting the woman to ask Him for living water instead. As is typical in St. John's gospel, there are varying levels of understanding present in the dialogue [see also the conversation with Nicodemus, (Jn. 3: 1-21)]. The woman is thinking about water to quench thirst while Jesus is offering something more. Ultimately, I suggest Jesus is inviting us (through her) to BAPTISM. Jesus is the source or fountain of living water (grace, the Holy Spirit) which we initially receive through the sacrament of baptism.

It is no secret that I am very frustrated when people do not see an urgency to get baptized themselves or to have their children baptized. According to the **Code of Canon Law**: *Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks* (canon 867). Instead they may wait years or decide to let the children "choose for themselves" when they get older. When baptism is delayed, sanctifying grace (God's life) is not present in a person's life. Remember, we are not born in a relationship with God, but rather separated because of original sin. Baptism washes away original sin (and actual sin, if one has reached the age of reason), makes one an adopted child of God and allows sanctifying grace to enter a person's life. Do I not want this for myself and/or my children? Is there no sense of urgency?

I Do Not Have a Husband. While the woman denies that she has a husband, Jesus reminds her she has had five. As one of my seminary professors once put it: "She was the Elizabeth Taylor of her time." This part of the dialogue reminded me about the importance of Catholics rectifying any marriage situation that is not seen as valid in the eyes of the Church. People in the congregation are sometimes married, divorced and then remarried outside the Catholic Church. Or they were never married in the Catholic Church in the first place. Unless the proper permissions were sought out and granted, these marriages may be invalid according to Church law. The longstanding Catholic teaching is that one should not receive Holy Communion, (or be a godparent or sponsor, or be an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, etc.), until such rectified. An annulment may be needed. Or a convalidation of the marriage may be necessary. Or the couple may be required to live in a brother/sister relationship, if nothing else can be done. It is best to set up an appointment with a priest to help discern what may be possible or necessary.

I am He, the One Speaking with You. As their dialogue continues, Jesus reveals his identity as the long-expected messiah. It is of utmost importance that we all realize the implications of this reality. Jesus is the messiah. He is also God's only-begotten Son. Salvation comes through Him and on His terms, not ours. *I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me* (Jn. 14: 6). The Samaritan woman believed in Him. She also witnessed to others about Jesus. She led others to believe in Jesus. Similarly, if we acknowledge Jesus as our Lord, God, and Savior, then we must also bring others to Him. Go and make disciples (Mt. 28: 19). Start in your family. Witness to your friends. Tell the whole world what God has done for you!

Jesus continually uses unlikely people to be His disciples and his missionaries: fishermen, tax collectors, Samaritan women, you and me.

Let's not waste any more time getting started or continuing to make excuses! Fr. Ed Namíotka, Pastor

There is a great effort on the part of the Bishops, dioceses, parishes to inform the parishioners, to animate and interest them to take this movement seriously and to become involved in one's own faith again. God as a Father is waiting with open arms for us to "come HOME to Him, not just on our own, but with the Faith Worshipping Community we call parish. The parish is GOD's family, the family of the Eucharist, where we come, pray, worship and receive JESUS in the Eucharist and are continually being refreshed, taught and strengthened in our Faith by HIM. The invitation is there for every single one of us, but it is up to each of us to respond to the invitation to return to Mass and to worship with the parish community. We need to teach our children this important aspect of our FAITH, to be part of a worshipping community as one family. In God as Father. Some very important events are coming up this month of March to invite all of us practicing and non practicing Catholics to participate and to allow the LOVE of JESUS in

the Eucharist and the flame of the Holy Spirit to touch our heart in a tangible way, credible to our own emotional and spiritual life. Are

we even willing and eager to

#### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 19, 2023 - John 9:1-41

Jesus said to the man once blind, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" The man answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?: Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." The man said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshipped him. Then Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see, might see, and those who do see, might become blind."

#### **Commentary:**

It's no crime to wake up one day and realize you've been oblivious to a great truth about yourself. What IS a crime is never to wake up and make that discovery. The wise folks we know got that way by walking a while on the path of humility, encountering brutal truths about themselves all along the way. They've confronted their own blindness many times, and surrendered to the sometimes-painful procedure of having their sight restored again and again. Being human implies a limited perspective. We don't see perfectly, and we have to keep working at clarifying our vision. Honest relationships assist that process naturally. So does surrendering to the words of Scripture and the sacraments most deliberately. Confession helps. The only thing that harms us, frankly, is refusing to see.

#### **Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
