*"Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?'" JOHN 11:40*

## From the Pastor's Desk

### The Annunciation

Dear Parishioners,

Around **March 25<sup>th</sup>** each year, I anxiously await what most people receive at *Christmas*—an annual card from a friend. Fr. Tom has chosen to send out **Annunciation** Day cards instead of the normal Christmas cards. The bottom of his card this year (2023) reads:

*As long as our country treats the fruit of the womb as a disposable item in a subhuman culture, I will send my Christmas cards nine months early to proclaim to the world that the child in the womb is sacred.*

In the past, his cards have given recipients other reminders:

*And finally after nine months they give birth to humans who are our sons and daughters. They do not grow pre-human life forms that become human once they leave a woman. What an insult to women. That to live inside of our mother is to forfeit human dignity.*

*Jesus entered our world as a child in the womb of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary. He revealed to us His Father in Heaven. May we recognize Him in the least among us, even our unborn sons and daughters as we seek the Face of God together.*

I wrote the following poem many years ago when reflecting on the sacredness and value of each human life:

#### I Cried

I cried—no one heard me  
Yet I cried—  
For I was inside  
Of my mother's womb.

I longed to be held in her arms,  
To be fondled and caressed,  
To take milk from my mother's breast  
And to laugh.

Such beauty and warmth of life  
I could enjoy,  
Play with my first toy  
And begin to love.

I could leave my print on the world:  
Wisdom to span the ages,  
As the knowledge of sages  
Of years past.

Still, more than this all, I long for life  
—That gift God-given—  
And the chance to live in  
His created world.

I cried—and no one heard me

Little did I know it would be my tomb.  
I cried.

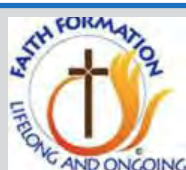

It is important to connect our children with the Gospel we hear at Sunday Mass. In other words, we need to teach our children that there are both obvious and hidden messages in the Gospel that apply to our existence on earth and the future

on in heaven. The priest in the homily, tries to teach about the Gospel lessons, but then we need to look at ourselves and see how all of it applies to ME personally. In the Gospel of this Sunday, the obvious lesson is that Jesus is God and he resurrected people from the dead.

He performed many miracles just as astonishing as this one. The hidden messages we

can gather from the story is that, like Lazarus, there are parts in us that are not living and fruitful. These are parts of us that JESUS wants to rise from the dead. An examination of conscience can help: what is dry in us that needs to be revitalized or restored. Perhaps our faith in GOD, our TRUST IN

JESUS, or respect for parents, teachers, authority figures around us. Perhaps our kindness toward others as gowns dull, especially toward people we don't like. We use forms of bullying that may not appear as such but do cut others down. *Yes, everyone has areas in our subconscious that have become dull, dry or even dead. JESUS can raise them up again in full bloom and life, if we open our whole being and life to HIM.*

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, April 2, 2023- Matthew 26:14-27:66

Jesus cried out in a loud voice, and gave up his spirit. And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God."

#### Commentary:

Only in the Passion according to Matthew do we hear the story of the raising of the saints. The details of the splitting of the temple sanctuary veil, the earthquake, and the tombs releasing their hold on the saints are unique to this gospel. What is the evangelist trying to tell us? The temple veil covered the Holy of Holies—that part of the sanctuary where the Ark of the Covenant was once kept. This was God's special dwelling place in Israel, and God was not to be revealed indiscriminately to all. With the tearing of the veil, the divine presence is no longer concealed. God is "loose" in Jerusalem! And in the same hour, death itself loses its mystery as its hidden captives are set free from the bonds of their shrouds. Resurrection means the mystery's out: Jesus Christ is Lord!

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?



**Pro-Life Corner:** Abortion has become a slippery slope from which infanticide and euthanasia are snowballing. The gift of life itself is now unimportant; it's the 'quality' of life that counts in this way of thinking.
