From the Pastor's Desk

Coincidences or Signs from God?

Dear Parishioners,

For the past two years I have attended priest conferences given by the **St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology.** This year I also plan to attend. Priests gather from all parts of the country to listen to talks on the Sacred Scriptures, to pray together, to offer Mass together and to socialize at a resort in Lakeway, Texas (near Austin). We have the privilege of hearing from *Dr. Scott Hahn*, *Dr. John Bergsma*, *Dr. Edward Sri*, and others who bring great insight to the Scriptures and Catholic theology. I hope that my preaching and teaching each week has been informative and inspiring as I have attempted to apply this experience to enhance my words at the pulpit.

Coincidentally, my first full day in Texas is also the day of the total solar eclipse which will be seen in the early afternoon as the path is directly over us! Moreover, the day is also celebrated as the **Solemnity of the Annunciation of Our Lord** (transferred from March 25th because it fell in Holy Week). Let me say that it should be rather interesting to be in Texas during this time. The Sunday after Easter (this weekend) has been designated as **Divine Mercy Sunday**.

On April 30, 2000 (*Divine Mercy Sunday* of that year), Pope St. John Paul II canonized *St. Maria Faustina of the Blessed Sacrament* and designated the Sunday after Easter as *Divine Mercy Sunday*.

According to the notebooks of Saint Faustina, Jesus made the following statements about this day: On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. (Diary of Saint Faustina, 699)

Devotion to Divine Mercy is also associated with an image painted as Jesus wished, based on descriptions by Saint Faustina. The words that accompany the image are "Jesus, I trust in Thee" ("Jezu, Ufam Tobie" in Polish). The rays coming from Jesus' body represent the Blood and Water that poured forth from the wound He suffered when pierced by the lance.

The devotion is practiced by praying the *Divine Mercy Chaplet* and *Novena to the Divine Mercy*—both of which may be prayed at any time, but especially at "The Hour of Great Mercy" – 3:00 PM, the hour our Lord died, and in conjunction with *Divine Mercy Sunday*. You can find out more about these topics by going to the website for the *Marians of the Immaculate Conception* (marian.org).

I find it particularly interesting that after working to promote devotion to the Divine Mercy and even writing an encyclical about God's Mercy—Dives in Misericordia or Rich in Mercy (1980)—Pope St. John Paul II died during the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005.

Was this just another *coincidence* or truly an indication of the hand of God continually at work in our world? With all that is happening in our world today, we all need to say and believe:

Jesus I trust in Thee!

bottom, is as revealed to St. Faustina by Jesus In the year 2000, St. Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina, and made the <u>second Sunday of Easter to be</u> celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday

She wrote in her diary that Jesus told her: "My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for my kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone. I am always supporting you, so lean on Me as you struggle, fearing nothing.... When you go to confession, to this fountain of My Mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from



My Heart always flows down upon your soul and ennobles it. Every time you go to confession, immerse yourself entirely in My mercy, with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of My grace upon your soul. I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in your soul".

On this Sunday of the Divine Mercy, let us renew our trust in our Lord Jesus, so that our personal experience of His great Mercy may bring many others to his Compassionate and Loving Heart



Excerpt from the Gospel for Third Sunday of Easter, April 14, 24 - Luke 24:35-48

"...Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

<u>Commentary:</u> In today's Gospel, Jesus appears among the disciples. Even though they have heard that he appeared to Simon and to the disciples on the road to Emmaus, they think he is a ghost. At Jesus' invitation to touch him, to look at his wounds, they are filled with joy, but they do not completely believe. Only his eating in their presence convinces them that he is indeed the risen Lord. As he had done on the road, he opens their minds to the Scriptures. After he has done this, he sends them to share the Good News with others.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

Easter Message of Pope Francis

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- Just as Jesus removed the stone that sealed his tomb on the morning of the Resurrection, on Easter Christ alone "has the power to roll away the stones that block the path to life" and which trap humanity in war and injustice, Pope Francis said.

Seated on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, the pope asked the risen Christ to bring peace in Israel, Palestine and Ukraine and a host of other conflict-ridden regions in the world.

Pope Francis then appealed to the international community to ensure access of humanitarian aid to Gaza and called for the "prompt release" of hostages taken during Hamas' attack on Israel Oct. 7 as well as "an immediate cease-fire in the strip."

"War is always an absurdity, war is always a defeat," he said, asking that the "strengthening winds of war" do not reach Europe and the Mediterranean. "Let us not yield to the logic of weapons and re-arming. Peace is never made with arms, but with outstretched hands and open hearts."
