Stewardship Corner: The Most Holy Trinity Good Stewards

"The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ..." - ROMANS 8:16-17

If we are heirs to the kingdom of God, shouldn't we work to build up His kingdom? Shouldn't we be good Stewards of our inheritance, using our time in prayer, our talent in charitable works and our treasure to care for the Church that God has left to us? Our Church is a treasured heirloom from God. Do we treat it that way?

From the Pastor's Desk
Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi and 40 Hours

Dear Parishioners,

Trinity Sunday focuses on the mystery of the Triune Godhead as revealed to us by Jesus. Recall that the Jewish people were strict *monotheists*. It must have been quite a startling revelation for them that the One True God is a unity of three Divine Persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus made known the mystery of the Trinity for us. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #261) This teaching is not something that we would be able to figure out for ourselves without God's revelation.

Next week, we will celebrate ***Corpus Christi*** (which is celebrated in the universal Church on a Thursday—the day of the Last Supper—but moved to Sunday in the United States). This solemnity is all about the gift of the Holy Eucharist. How can the Son of God be truly present under the form of bread and wine? The *Catechism* instructs us:

It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to his Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take his departure from his own in his visible form, he wanted to give us his sacramental presence; since he was about to offer himself on the cross to save us, he wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which he loved us "to the end," even to the giving of his life. In his Eucharistic presence he remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loved us and gave himself up for us, and he remains under signs that express and communicate this love. (CCC, #1380)

Volumes have been written and countless sermons preached over the centuries on both of these topics. From a pragmatic point of view, why not take time during the next few weeks to reflect on the wisdom of the *Catechism* as it tries to enlighten us about our Catholic faith? We should continually seek greater understanding and clarity as we try to delve more deeply into the precious mysteries of our faith that have been revealed to us.

I plan to have an **outside Eucharistic Procession with Benediction around our grounds (weather permitting) at the end of the 4:30 PM Mass on Saturday, June 1st**. This will be an opportunity to give special honor to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, especially during this time of Eucharistic Revival taking place in the United States.

Also in a few weeks (**June 20 to 22**), our parish will spend **40 Hours** in adoration of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. We will add two additional evening Masses at 7 PM on Thursday and Friday evenings (June 20-21) and close the 40 Hours at a Mass on Saturday (June 22) at a special 10 AM Mass. This day is fittingly the feast of the patron of our parish, St. Thomas More. Please take the time to **sign-up with a commitment to spend an hour or more of your time in His divine presence**. May we always realize *Who* we have before us on our altars and in our tabernacles and *Who* we are privileged to receive in Holy Communion: **Jesus, the Son of God**.



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today the Church celebrates the Trinity Sunday, the Mystery of the Triune God in one: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is a mystery and will always be so while we are on earth.

However, sometimes we are given glimpses into God's divine life.

The Bible reveals the Trinity in 1 John 4:8.16, which describes love as triune, consisting of three parts: **the lover, the beloved, and the love.**

At the beginning of the Celebration of Mass the Priest and all the faithful always sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross: we are gathered in the name of the Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), as a baptized people (in the name of the Trinity), redeemed by the Cross of Christ. Every time we bless ourselves with the sign of the Cross we proclaim the Mystery of the Trinity. As Christians, we share in this Trinitarian love and we are invited to live within this love.

How beautiful would today be if we can spend some time being more aware of this great Mystery of Love by thanking and praising the Triune God in each Person: God the Father, the Creator of the world and our loving Creator; God the Son, Jesus, our loving Redeemer who made and makes his life a living sacrifice for us; God the Holy Spirit who always inflames our hearts with His love for Him to be shared to others...

Eucharistic Revival quotes from Pope Francis

"The Eucharist is the culmination of Jesus' entire life, which was a single act of love toward the Father and brothers and sisters.

There, too, as with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves, Jesus took the bread in his hands, raised a prayer of blessing to the Father, broke the bread, and gave it to his disciples; and he did the same with the cup of wine. But in that moment, on the eve of his Passion, with that gesture, he wished to leave the Testament of his new and eternal Covenant, a perpetual memorial of the Paschal Mystery of his death and resurrection" *Angelus—June 23, 2019*



THE MOST HOLY TRINITY, MAY 26, 2024

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 2, 2024- Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and give it to his disciples, saying, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and they all drank from it. "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many," he said to them. "Truly I tell you, I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

Commentary:

If you have received worthily, "St. Augustine preached, "you become what you have received." In sharing the body of Christ, we become the body of Christ. If we partake of the one bread and cup, then we must be willing to become Eucharist for others — to make the love of Christ real for all. At our own parish table, we come to the Eucharist to celebrate our identity as his disciples and to seek the sustaining grace to live the hard demands of such discipleship. We make our parish family's table the Lord's own table, a place of reconciliation and compassion.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

9th Anniversary of Laudato Si

In 2015, Pope Francis released his second encyclical, "[Laudato si – On Care for Our Common Home](#)", as a letter to the Church and to all people of good will. In it, Francis urges the world to think critically, creatively, and compassionately about the environmental and social crises we face today on a global scale.

Continuing in the Church's long-standing tradition of reminding us how connected ecological and social justice issues are to our faith, the Pope puts forth one of the most comprehensive analyses of our current global situation. It includes many dimensions, from the scientific evidence of ecological damage, through the critique of certain philosophical fallacies that our modern society is built on, all the while pointing to a way forward with hope, through the rich tradition of Christian faith.

Using the expression of Pope John Paul II, the encyclical calls Christians to a deeper "ecological conversion," "whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them" (152). It also encourages dialogue among all people who share our common home to cultivate a sense of solidarity and brotherhood that can "can inspire us to greater creativity and enthusiasm in
