He gives us the resources we need to do His work. **Are you listening for God's call? When you hear it, do you get on your feet and do the work He asks of you? Do not be afraid. God doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called.** Answer His call.

## From the Pastor's Desk

### Summertime, Summertime . . .

Dear Parishioners,

I find it quite disturbing for me to address some of the matters concerning the lack of **modesty** found in society today. Let me begin by saying that I was not raised in an atmosphere where I lived a *sheltered life*. I may have been exposed, sadly, to just about everything humanly imaginable as a youth.

I grew up in Wildwood, NJ. My parents owned a hotel, motel, apartments and a restaurant. I frequented the beach and boardwalk. People rented rooms in our establishment with their families, spouses, significant others, mistresses, complete strangers, etc. We lived across the street from a bar notoriously known to have served alcohol to those underage. Drugs were available and used all around the neighborhood. Regrettably, I was far from naive when it came to things of the world. It is a miracle itself that I became a priest.

With all of this past history in mind, I was shocked on my recent Caribbean cruise to see many bathing suits that could have passed for *band-aids*. Dare I say there was a lack of *modesty*? I have come to the conclusion that most people look much better *with their clothes on*. The magic mirror some may have been looking at was not the same as what my eyes were seeing.

Unfortunately, traces of this lack of modesty permeates even our churches (and schools). Short-shorts (we used to call them *hotpants* in my day), excessive skin exposure (legs or cleavage) are certainly not appropriate for Mass attendance. We should not dress like we are going to the beach or boardwalk. Manner of dress should be befitting the dignity of being in the presence of Almighty God because we are doing just that!

The sexualization of youth worldwide is appalling and our young people should be taught that their bodies are not for display, let alone for perverts to gawk at. Parents need to be parents. **No** is an option.

Let me conclude by quoting two sections from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* for your reflection: **purity** and **modesty**.

**Purity** requires modesty, an integral part of temperance. Modesty protects the intimate center of the person. It means refusing to unveil what should remain hidden. It is ordered to chastity to whose sensitivity it bears witness. It guides how one looks at others and behaves toward them in conformity with the dignity of persons and their solidarity. (#2521)


**Modesty** protects the mystery of persons and their love. It encourages patience and moderation in loving relationships; it requires that the conditions for the definitive giving and commitment of man and woman to one another be fulfilled. Modesty is decency. It inspires one's choice of clothing. It keeps silence or reserve where there is evident risk of unhealthy curiosity. It is discreet. (#2522)

I wish that I did not need to bring this topic to anyone's attention. However, I would be negligent as a *spiritual father* to pretend that certain situations do not exist all around us.

*On vacation with a friend Saint Kateri, the first native American Saint*

On July 14 we celebrate the feast of saint Kateri Tekakwitha, the first native American Saint. Her father was the chief of the "Mohawk" tribe (near the New York), and her mother was an Algonquin, a converted Christian. When Kateri was only four years old, smallpox attacked her village, taking the lives of her parents and baby brother, leaving Kateri orphan. She grew into a young girl, with a gentle, loving personality by helping her aunts work in the fields where they tended to the corn, beans, and squash, and took care of the traditional tribal house in which they lived. Here, Kateri's life was the same as other young Indigenous girls: with days filled with chores and spending happy times with other girls and living with this indigenous people, beautiful relationships built on reciprocity, respect, gratitude, and responsibility and gratitude to God for life and the world around us.

Leading a simple life Kateri remained faithful to her love for Jesus through prayer. ***Her greatest wish was to know and to do what pleased God.*** Kateri died at the age of 24. Her last words were, "Jesus, I love You." By becoming closer to her, she can be our good friend that teaches us how to be Jesus' special friend, receiving all his love from Him, and sharing it to others, wherever we are!



### Eucharistic Revival quotes from Pope Francis

"Do! The Eucharist is not simply an act of remembrance; it is a fact: The Lord's

Passover is made present once again for us. In Mass the death and resurrection of Jesus are set before us. Do this in remembrance of me: come together and celebrate the Eucharist as a community, as a people, as a family, in order to remember me. We cannot do without the Eucharist for it is God's memorial. And it heals our wounded memory"—Homily— June 14, 2020

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

**Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 14, 2024 - Mark 6:7-13**

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two... "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

**Commentary:**

The Twelve are sent to the towns of Galilee. It is a trial mission that looks ahead to the Christian mission, our mission, to the world at large. All Christians (and that includes us) are to speak for God in the world by word and/or deed, even when the world does not care to listen. Jesus tells the Twelve, and he tells us, to get moving on this mission right away. We are to travel lightly. Jesus gives us what is needed: his authority and his teaching. All depends on Jesus: the call, the sending, and what is needed to carry on the mission.

**Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?






