From the Pastor's Desk

The Greatest Gift

Dear Parishioners,

With the many advances of technology, what I write here has the potential to reach *many more people* than those who sit in our pews each weekend. Necessarily, if a rather significant number of parishioners in an average parish are <u>not</u> part of the Saturday evening/Sunday routine of going to Mass, then this bulletin article also has to attempt to reach those who will *not* be worshipping with us this week. The bulletin is also available online to those who may be *away from home*, such as **college students**, those travelling for business, etc. My hope and prayer is that this message will go out *far and wide* each week.

As Catholic Christians, we need to seek out *the spiritual things* in life. Life is very *materialistic*. We are constantly bombarded in commercials and advertisements that we **must buy** this particular item, that we are somehow **incomplete** or **missing out on something** if we do not own *the latest*, *the best*, *the most expensive*, etc. We need to *buy*, *buy*, *and buy*! And it's all a *lie*!

What makes us complete? What really gives us value or significance in life? The *greatest gift* that anyone can be given does not have a price tag and cannot be bought. It is not something that will impress those who see things with a *worldly* or *materialistic* set of eyes. It is rather something of a completely *spiritual* nature—the gift of **faith**.

When we are baptized, we receive the **gift of faith**. It is a *gift*—not something we *buy*, not something that we *earn*. It is a gift, pure and simple. If you have been given this gift, then *thank God for it*. If you are a *parent*, it is the most important gift that you could ever give your child. It happens by the simple pouring of water in the sacrament of Baptism: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." Through Baptism we become a **child of God**; adopted by *God Himself*! Jesus is God's only begotten Son by nature from all eternity. We become His *adopted* child through baptism. God is our *Father*, truly *our Father*!

I really wonder how much we actually think about our Baptism and the *gift of faith* that we have received through it? Whenever we walk into the church and bless ourselves with the water from the **holy water font**, we should be reminded of the fact of our Baptism. *I have been given the greatest gift! I am a Child of God!* Faith, being a gift, can be *lost* or *grow cold* if it is not fostered. That is why it is so essential that we *practice our faith*—that we come together as a faith community at Mass. We need to worship together as children of the one God *as a family*. Hearing the **Word of God** and receiving Jesus in the **Holy Eucharist** *regularly* will help our faith to grow. Moreover, faith in the **Holy Eucharist** is faith in Jesus Christ himself! It is His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity we are privileged to receive at Mass.

For those who may <u>not</u> be baptized or who have <u>not</u> yet had your children baptized, please *think about*, *pray about* and *ask for* this precious gift though the **Sacrament of Baptism**. Adults seeking Baptism should inquire about the **O.C.I.A.** (*Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*) program.

Sometimes the most precious things in life are the things that we cannot buy. The **gift of faith** is one such gift. Faith in **Jesus Christ** as the **Son of God** leads to *eternal life*! That is something no amount of money can ever buy! It is simply a gift—the *greatest gift*!

Eucharistic Revival quotes from Pope Francis

Where do they find the strength? It is the Eucharist: in the power of the Risen Lord's love, who today too breaks bread for us and

repeats: "Do this in remembrance of me." Homily—May 26, 2016

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 1, 2024 - Mark 7:1-8

The Pharisees and Scribes questioned Jesus. "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" Jesus responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me, in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."

Commentary:

Most of our mothers would side with the Pharisees: no one should come to the table with unwashed hands! Hygiene, of course, was not the issue in Jesus' day. The matter was one of respect for the authority of tradition. We might imagine today's Pharisees saying, "Why didn't that woman genuflect before going into the pew? Why didn't that man kneel during the consecration? Why did that family leave Mass early or arrive so late? Responding to the Pharisees and Scribes, Jesus moves the discussion from outward observances to inward intention, calling us back to the true purpose of Law and tradition: conversion of heart.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
