

Stewards Blessed

"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." -DEUTERONOMY 26:10

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits" - the first and best that you have to offer? Or do you give from what you have leftover? Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? We aren't owners of anything, we are merely **Stewards** of God's gifts. Pray for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.



From the Pastor's Desk Facing Your Demons

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel (Lk. 4: 1-13) we see Jesus *tempted by the devil*. I think the example of this series of *temptations* is a most valuable instruction for anyone desiring to take Lent seriously. Obviously the Church does as well, since the first Sunday of each Lent begins by recalling these temptations.

First, we see that Jesus was *led by the Spirit into the desert*. Why would the Spirit lead Jesus into the *desert*? The desert is an austere place where a person must confront many harsh realities: severe weather, lack of comfortable amenities, silence and danger, as a start. When we are deprived of creature comforts, remove noisy distractions, and must face harsh realities, we *can* and *should* begin to realize the complete dependence that we have on Almighty God. We are put in a situation where the desert and its silence can become the place where we hear the voice of God more clearly and powerfully. And that is where Satan often begins to interfere as well.

Jesus *fasted for forty days*. Not only was he in the desert, but he also took on bodily penance. *He was hungry*. Why deprive ourselves of anything? If we live only for this world, then self-sacrifice, mortification, and penance seem ridiculous. However, **denying oneself** (and picking up the cross) was given as a condition for discipleship by Jesus (See Mt. 16:24). Discipline and self-sacrifice strengthen a person both physically and spiritually. A person becomes more prepared to live out the sacrificial love Jesus most perfectly demonstrated by His death on the cross.

Why, then, when we are trying to do something spiritually beneficial, do temptations arise? Let's face this harsh reality head on: Satan and his followers hate anyone trying to serve the Lord and grow closer to Him. They will put any possible obstacle in our way to prevent this from happening. We may be tempted to physical, earthly **pleasure** (food, drink, sex, drugs, and anything that makes us feel good or gives us a temporary "high") instead of the eternal, spiritual satisfaction that comes from the love of Almighty God. Basically, it is hedonism to one degree or another. *Command that stones become loaves of bread*.

Temptation can take the form of **wealth or earthly goods**. Material possessions become the reason for my existence. My home, my car, my vacation(s), my boat, my bank account, my jewelry, etc. become my *god*. I think more *things* will make me happy. *All the kingdoms of the world* . . . *I shall give you*. At what price? This was the second temptation in the desert (materialism).

Finally, we can be tempted by our **ego**. Whenever we are proud (in the sense of *hubris*), boastful, unwilling to seek help (when needed), arrogant, or overconfident in our own ability or skills, we can ascend that *parapet* where we think that we do not need God. Or worse yet, we think that we are *god*. No one can tell me what to do. I know best. I will not serve. This type of thinking (egoism) is represented in Jesus' temptation from the parapet of the temple.

Remember, temptation is <u>not</u> sin. In his humanity, Jesus resisted these temptations and did not sin. He faced Satan head on and rejected his false allurements. Jesus showed us that when we focus and direct our actions completely on the love of God, then we have the ability to do the same. *The Lord, your God, shall you worship and Him alone shall you serve*.

Go into the desert this Lent. Face your demons. It is there where they can be confronted and conquered.

FIRST SUNDAY of LENT- March 9, 2025

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent, March 16– Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem...While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over Peter, James, and John, and they became frightened...Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

Commentary:

Entering the darkness is always a scary business. Abram did it and encountered the presence of God. The three disciples did it and heard a mysterious voice reveal the true identity of Jesus. The only way to the radiant light of God is by way of the darkness. But it's the way we most fear and resist, because we can't find our own way or control what happens to us there. Loss of control, or what we might call total surrender to God's purposes, is precisely the point. As long as we pursue our agenda and say, "My will be done," we get what we want. We get earth. We get stuff. We also inherit the legacy of a selfish, loveless history. When we pray, "Thy will be done," the landscape changes. We enter the darkness to emerge in a glorious reality we call the reign of God. The light is much better there, and we can finally see rightly.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing: 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?

2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

Who are the Undocumented?

There has been a lot of talk about undocumented immigrants. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops published Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration and the Movement of Peoples. In it they say "Jesus reiterates the Old Testament command to love and care for the stranger, a criterion by which we shall be judged: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me" (Mt 25:35)."

A 30 year old father of three stood up against unfair and inhumane actions by his Nicaraguan government. Their peaceful protests were met with three of his friends being killed. Threats to him and his family made it impossible for them to remain in their homeland. They sought escape and freedom in the US. He is now facing extreme difficulty obtaining the necessary US documentation because the Nicaraguan government deleted his existence, including records of his college degree. They are neighbors of ours, living in Camden County. He has a full-time job in the US and is barely able support his family.




