

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

2nd Sunday of Lent Grateful Stewardship

"I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land as a possession." - GENESIS 15:7

Just as the Lord gave Abraham, Moses, and the Israelites a land to possess, He has also given each of us a home. Whether your home is grand or humble, it is a gift from God. Abraham prepared a great sacrifice to the Lord in gratitude for the home God gave him. How do you show your gratitude to God for the home He has given you? Do you make a <u>Stewards</u> sacrifice of any kind? Do you return any of your finances to God, investing in your eternal home just as you invest in your earthly home?



From the Pastor's Desk Where's the Beef?

Dear Parishioners,

When I was young my family *never* ate *meat* on Fridays <u>in general</u>, let alone *Fridays in Lent*. Naturally, as a young, curious boy I wanted to know "why?" We grew up with the understanding that **Friday** was the day that Jesus died on the cross and we should make some sacrifice on that day. Therefore, we didn't eat **meat**. But why *meat*? We could eat pizza and shrimp (some of my personal favorites!) and other things that I enjoyed which didn't really seem like much of a sacrifice to me. What was the big deal about *meat*? And why was that *fish symbol* on our Catholic calendars on Fridays?

That's where I had to investigate and find an answer that seemed to make sense to me. I heard that *meat* was associated with *feasting*, not fasting. We heard it stated in the Bible that we should go and kill "the fattened calf" when it was time to celebrate (cf. Luke 15: 23, 30).

Okay. That made sense. But how was *fish* supposedly different?

Most of the answers that I found seemed rather *legalistic* in the sense that there was some hair splitting about what *could* and *could not* be eaten. Seemed almost like old time *Pharisaical Judaism* to me. According to some interpretations, we could eat *lobster*, *shrimp* and *crab* but we needed to stay away from *hot dogs*, *bologna* and even *Spam*! (To be honest, I'm really not quite sure how much real *meat* is in these products anyway!)

That's where I think that Jesus' condemnation of the Pharisees and their legalism seemed to make sense. He would tell them that they insisted on keeping the *letter* of the law rather than the *spirit* of the law in many instances. (cf. Matthew 12 or 15). Unfortunately, they never really *got it*!

What then *is* appropriate for Lent? Why not try a *simple, meatless meal*! How profound. Vegetable soup, salad and bread seem appropriate. A grilled cheese sandwich with some tomato soup also appears to keep the spirit of penance. Ethnic meals like *polenta*, potato *pierogi* or rice and beans also seem to fit the bill.

I would definitely avoid the broiled seafood combination and the lobster tail with drawn butter or any kind of extravagant seafood buffet.

Perhaps those things are a bit *excessive* in the spirit of Lenten *penance* and even if they are not technically *meat*!

Besides, too much shellfish can sometimes give you gout.

SECOND SUNDAY of LENT- March 16, 2025

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent, March 23, 2025 - Luke 13:1-9

Jesus told this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not, you can cut it down."

<u>Commentary:</u> Another name for God is Compassion. It's a word that means "to suffer with," and in the life of Jesus, we see how God came to reveal that name to us. In the story of the orchard, we often think God is represented by the impatient owner who wants the fruitless tree cut down. Since we've been taught to think of God as the great Judge in the sky, this identification makes sense. But in the story, Jesus takes the role of the gardener who desires to rescue the tree from imminent destruction. One more year, he begs, and I shall try again to coax this barren tree into life. That second chance is offered to each of us from the God of Second Chances, the God who cares about flailing humanity unable to pull its act together despite a long history of knowing better. Each Lent is that second chance, another season that comes to us like a gift and an opportunity to turn the page and the corner on where we've been headed.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?






