

STEWARDSHIP CORNER The Most Holy Trinity Stewards Pray

"But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth..." (JOHN 16:13)

It has been said that the best gift we can give someone is to teach them how to pray. If you don't talk and more importantly, listen, to God every day, how else will you know what He is calling you to do? Just as you talk to family and friends every day, get in the habit of talking with God every day. Develop a **Stewardship** daily prayer routine. Keep your prayers simple and sincere. This is best done in silence, when you can hear God's response.



From the Pastor's Desk An Eternal Exchange of Love

Dear Parishioners,

On this **Trinity Sunday**, I share some reflections on the **Holy Trinity**—a most profound mystery of our faith.

First, we should realize that Jesus opened up for us the inner life of God. He revealed that God was a Trinity of Persons. Recall, the Jewish people are strict monotheists—Hear O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! (Dt. 6: 4)—and they held on to this belief despite being surrounded, invaded and conquered by various polytheistic cultures (e.g., Rome). However, Jesus began to teach his disciples God is Father—His Father—and this must have caused significant concern for those around Him. He equated Himself with God, His Father: The Father and I are one. (Jn. 10:30) What exactly does He mean? He also promised to send the Holy Spirit to His disciples once He was gone: But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you (Jn. 16: 7). There is no natural way that we could figure out on our own that God was a Trinity of Persons without Jesus revealing this mystery to us.

Next, we are told that *God is love* (1 Jn. 4:8) Therefore, the experience of **love** itself seems to indicate that there should be a *lover* and a *beloved*. Within the Trinity, the Father loves the Son from all eternity and the Son loves the Father from all

eternity. The love between the two is also a Person: the Holy Spirit.

God's very being is love. By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC # 221)

I contend that things in this world reflect and model for us certain eternal truths—albeit <u>imperfectly</u>—and help us to understand some mysteries of our faith better. Take the example of a **family**. A husband loves his wife and the wife loves her husband. Their love for each other can be manifest in a child who is the result of their love for each other. In essence, there is a type of a Trinitarian love involved here: the love between husband, wife and child. Again, the example is <u>not</u> perfect as God is *uncreated*, but it does shed some light on an otherwise complicated topic.

Another example from our life experience helps us with our understanding the Trinity. Take H_2O which can appear in nature as water, steam or ice. All three have the same chemical composition but can appear in different forms depending on temperature. This helps us to see how something can be *three* and *one* at the very same time. Our belief in the Holy Trinity teaches that there are Three Divine Persons in the One True God.

Every time you make the *Sign of the Cross*, think about how we acknowledge our belief in the Holy Trinity. By God's immense love for us, we are invited to share in the life of the Trinity and to dwell one day within that *eternal exchange of love*.

The whole idea can indeed be mind-boggling.





The Most Holy Trinity—June 15, 2025

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday.

Excerpt from the Gospel for The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 22, 2025 - Luke 9:11b-17

(Jesus asks the apostles to give the people on the hillside something to eat. There are more than 5,000 people present to listen to Jesus. The apostles complain that they only have five loaves and two fish. Jesus tells the apostles to have the people sit down. Then... "Jesus took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets."

Commentary:

Maybe the most perfect meal of all is the one in which no one goes home hungry. That's a meal yet to be celebrated on this planet, since a large portion of the human race goes to bed without having eaten at all. It is no exaggeration to say that it is the responsibility of those who enjoy the privilege of the Eucharist to make our best and most earnest contribution to the problem of world hunger. Every dollar we spend to eliminate hunger honors the example of Jesus, who fed the multitude in front of him simply because they were hungry. His words on that occasion - "Give them some food yourselves" - ring down through the centuries with an urgency and authority that we cannot ignore. Jesus also said, "What you do for the least of my sisters and brothers, you do for me." Dare we deny bread to the One who set the table that supplies us with everlasting life? And if we wonder how much we are obliged to give, the answer is plainly given. All must eat until they are satisfied, and then our offering can be deemed enough.
